 - ii) Outside School House, Raynton Drive.
- 2. Remove the redundant waiting restrictions opposite Nos. 70 to 88 Raynton Drive, Haves.
- 3. Install a raised zebra crossing outside Nos. 74 and 76 Raynton Drive, Hayes with a maximum height of 75mm and 1:20 gradient ramps on each approach.
- 4. Relocate the existing no stopping school keep clear markings operational 'Monday to Friday 8am to 10am and 2.30pm to 4.30pm' at the following locations along Raynton Drive, Haves:
 - i) Opposite Nos. 82 to 88 Raynton Drive.
 - ii) Opposite Nos. 58 to 68 Raynton Drive.
- 5. Extend the existing 'at any time' waiting restrictions opposite No. 18 Clifton Gardens, Hillingdon by 6.5 metres eastwards.




STATEMENT OF REASONS





- 4. No person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in a south-eastbound direction on Millington Road, Hayes, to turn around the south-eastern end of the traffic signals island and crossing refuge situated where the road meets the junction with Station Road, Hayes so as to face in the opposite north-westbound direction.
