



#### Hillingdon at a glance, 2017

- Population comparing the 2011 Census figures with those with GLA Interim 2015-based population projections, the borough's population in 2017 has increased by approximately 10.9% (from 273,936 to 303,870); by comparison London's population has increased by 8.5%. Over half of Hillingdon's 44.6 square miles is a mosaic of countryside including canals, rivers, parks and woodland. Hillingdon has an average of 25.9 people per hectare; this is the third lowest population density among London boroughs.
- **Gender** 152,246 of borough residents are male and 151,624 are female.
- Age 21.7% of the borough population is under 16, 6.1% over 75 and 72.1% aged 16-74 (this is defined as working age).
- Ethnicity Hillingdon's White British population decreased from 73% in the 2001 Census to 52% in the 2011 Census; Hillingdon's BAME population increased from 27% to 48% in the same period. Current data (from the Greater London Authority 2015 Round Trend-based Ethnic Group Population Projections) shows that Hillingdon's White British population in 2017 is 43% and the BAME population is 57%.
- Religion¹ the predominant religions in the borough at 2011 are Christian 134,813 (49.2%), Muslim 29,065 (10.6%), Hindu 22,033 (8%) and Sikh 18,230 (6.7%), we also have a large percentage of residents stating 'no religion' 46,492 (17%) and other 23,303 (8.5%).


#### **Harefield Ward**

Harefield lies in the north of Hillingdon and is bordered by Northwood, West Ruislip and Ickenham as well as Three Rivers and South Bucks District.

In 2017<sup>2</sup>, Harefield's population is 7,875 residents, an increase of 6.4% since 2011 (7,399); this is lower than the 10.9% increase for Hillingdon overall. Harefield is made up of 1,522.4 hectares (15.2 km<sup>sq</sup>), with 5.2 people per hectare (517 per km<sup>sq</sup>). The average number of people per household is 2.4<sup>3</sup>.

#### Deprivation

The 2015 Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) calculate local measures of deprivation and indicates where each small area is ranked in relation to the whole of England. The map below shows patterns of deprivation within Harefield, which is made up of five LSOAs<sup>4</sup>.





#### **Ward Population:**



The chart above shows that 19.6% of Harefield residents are under the age of 16. 71.1% of residents fall into the working age bracket (defined as a resident aged between 16 and 74) and the remaining 9.3% are over the age of 75.

The chart below shows that in Harefield, there are slightly higher numbers of males and females in the 50-54 age bracket when compared to other age groups.




#### Gender

The proportion of **men to women** in the ward is 48.7% to 51.3%. This is a small change from 2011 when there was a 48.2% to 51.8% male to female ratio in the ward.

The chart below shows male/female ratios in Hillingdon and ward level:


#### Male/Female ratio at Hillingdon and ward level, 2017




#### Ethnic make up 20115

In the 2011 census, 87.6% of Harefield residents identified themselves as White British background (this includes English, Northern Irish, Scottish, Welsh, Irish, Gypsy or Irish Traveller and Other White). 2.2% from Mixed / Multiple Ethnic groups, 6.7% from Asian / Asian British background (including Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi and Chinese), 2.3% from Black / African / Caribbean / Black British backgrounds and 1.2% from other ethnic backgrounds (including Arab).

#### Hillingdon, Ethnic makeup 2011:





#### Religion<sup>6</sup>


Christianity is the predominant religion in the ward with 65.3% from this faith. 2.2% are Hindu, 2.4% are Muslim and 21.5% have no religion. 6.5% chose not to state a religion (the question was voluntary).

#### Harefield, Religion 2011:




#### Hillingdon, Religion 2011:

#### Country of Birth<sup>7</sup>

Of those living in Harefield, 92.1% were **born** in Europe (with 86.7% in the UK), 3.8% in the Middle East / Asia, 3.1% in Africa, and 0.9% in the Americas, Caribbean or Australasia. In Harefield, 13.3% were **born** outside of the UK (with 86.7% in the UK).




The preferred **language** in the ward is English with 94.2% residents stating this as their main language. Of those remaining 5.8%, the majority speak English 'very well' or 'well'. Only 48 residents (11.6% of those where English is not their main language) state they cannot speak English well or at all<sup>8</sup>.

Apart from English, the most spoken languages in the ward are Polish (45 residents, 0.6%) and Gujurati (24 residents, 0.3%).

#### Working age breakdown (ages 16-74):



In Harefield, the working age population of those in the age bracket 16-24 make up 11.8% of the ward population, whilst the 25-59 age group make up 66.7%, the remaining 21.5% are from the 60-74 age group.


In Harefield, 72.5% of residents of working age are economically active. The table below provides a breakdown of economic activity in the ward when compared with Hillingdon and England:


Of those residents in employment, this chart provides an overview of the **Occupation Types**<sup>9</sup> across Harefield ward:

The chart below shows income deprivation being varied across Hillingdon. At ward level, the percentage of people who live in income deprived households ranges from 4.8% in Ickenham to 21.7% in Townfield. Harefield is 13.3%, which is just below the Hillingdon average (13.6%).

#### Households

In 2017, there were 3,255 households<sup>10</sup> in Harefield, an increase of 123 since Census 2011. The majority of **housing type**<sup>11</sup> within the ward is houses or bungalows (either detached, semi or terraced) at 77.3%, with 22.7% being flats or maisonettes (including those in a commercial building).

The diagram below shows the percentage of housing types at ward, borough and regional level.






In Harefield, 64.2% of ward residents own their own homes, followed by 10.2% of properties being privately rented, 24.0% socially rented from the Council and the remaining residents make up 1.6% other (eg shared ownership, living rent free).





#### Health

Life expectancy is the number of years a person is expected to live on average. In Harefield, the life expectancy is estimated at 77.9 years for males and 81.2 years for females. This is below the averages for Hillingdon and England.




#### Observed Prevalence<sup>12</sup>

These graphs show the recorded prevalence of long term conditions from the Quality & Outcomes Framework (QOF) 2017/18, at GP practice level. They show the calculated prevalence of patients on a GP register, recorded as having a given condition. It should be noted that patients registered in this ward do not necessarily live in the ward or the Borough.

The graphs show recorded prevalence at England, London, borough, locality and ward level. Harefield ward contains one GP surgery (Harefield Practice).


#### Cardiovascular conditions

The prevalence of **coronary heart disease** within Harefield is 3.29%; this is higher than England, London and Hillingdon, and the locality:



























#### Mental Health prevalence, 2017/18




The prevalence of **cancer** in Harefield is 2.64%, which is higher than London, Hillingdon and the locality but lower than England:




The prevalence of **diabetes** in Harefield is 7.14%, which is higher than England, London and the locality, but lower than Hillingdon:








#### **Other conditions**

The estimated prevalence is the number of patients who may have a condition but who have not been diagnosed.



Harefield ward contains one GP surgery (The Harefield Practice). As before, patients registered with this GP practice do not necessarily live in the ward or borough.




#### Estimated prevalence of Undiagnosed Hypertension Harefield, 2015










