

Hillingdon at a glance, 2017

- **Population** comparing the 2011 Census figures with those with GLA Interim 2015-based population projections, the borough's population in 2017 has increased by approximately 10.9% (from 273,936 to 303,870); by comparison London's population has increased by 8.5%. Over half of Hillingdon's 44.6 square miles is a mosaic of countryside including canals, rivers, parks and woodland. Hillingdon has an average of 25.9 people per hectare; this is the third lowest population density among London boroughs.
- **Gender** 152,246 of borough residents are male and 151,624 are female.
- Age 21.7% of the borough population is under 16, 6.1% over 75 and 72.1% aged 16-74 (this is defined as working age).
- Ethnicity Hillingdon's White British population decreased from 73% in the 2001 Census to 52% in the 2011 Census; Hillingdon's BAME population increased from 27% to 48% in the same period. Current data (from the Greater London Authority 2015 Round Trend-based Ethnic Group Population Projections) shows that Hillingdon's White British population in 2017 is 43% and the BAME population is 57%.
- Religion¹ the predominant religions in the borough at 2011 are Christian 134,813 (49.2%), Muslim 29,065 (10.6%), Hindu 22,033 (8%) and Sikh 18,230 (6.7%), we also have a large percentage of residents stating 'no religion' 46,492 (17%) and other 23,303 (8.5%).


Northwood Hills Ward

Northwood Hills lies in the north of Hillingdon and is bordered by Northwood and Eastcote & East Ruislip, as well as Three Rivers and the London Borough of Harrow.

In 2017², Northwood Hills' population is 12,370 residents, an increase of 6.8% since 2011 (11,578); this is lower than the 10.9% increase for Hillingdon overall. Northwood Hills is made up of 332.8 hectares (3.3 km^{sq}); with 37.2 people per hectare (3,717 per km^{sq}). The average number of people per household is 2.5³.

Deprivation


The 2015 Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) calculate local measures of deprivation and indicates where each small area is ranked in relation to the whole of England. The map below shows patterns of deprivation within Northwood Hills, which is made up of seven LSOAs⁴.



Ward Population:

The chart above shows that 20.1% of Northwood Hills' residents are under the age of 16. 71.1% of residents fall into the working age bracket (defined as a resident aged between 16 and 74) and the remaining 8.8% are over the age of 75.

The chart below shows that in Northwood Hills, there are higher numbers of males and females in the 40-44 age bracket when compared to other age groups.




Population pyramid for Northwood Hills, 2017

Gender

The proportion of men to women in the ward is 48.8% to 51.2%. This is a small change from 2011 when there was a 47.8% to 52.2% male to female ratio in the ward.







Male/Female ratio at Hillingdon and ward level, 2017


Ethnic make up 2011⁵

In the 2011 census, 66.7% of Northwood Hills' residents identified themselves as White British background (this includes English, Northern Irish, Scottish, Welsh, Irish, Gypsy or Irish Traveller and Other White). 3.9% from Mixed / Multiple Ethnic groups, 24.6% from Asian / Asian British background (including Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi and Chinese), 3.1% from Black / African / Caribbean / Black British backgrounds and 1.6% from other ethnic backgrounds (including Arab).

Hillingdon, Ethnic makeup 2011:





Religion⁶

Christianity is the predominant religion in the ward with 49.9% from this faith. 12.6% are Hindu, 6.3% are Muslim and 18.2% have no religion. 7.0% chose not to state a religion (the question was voluntary).

Northwood Hills, Religion 2011:




Hillingdon, Religion 2011:

Country of Birth⁷

Of those living in Northwood Hills, 79.7% were **born** in Europe (with 72.1% in the UK), 10.8% in the Middle East / Asia, 7.2% in Africa, and 2.2% in the Americas, Caribbean or Australasia. In Northwood Hills, 27.9% were **born** outside of the UK (with 72.1% in the UK).




Country of birth, excluding UK, Europe and South Asia *

The preferred **language** in the ward is English with 86.8% residents stating this as their main language; of the remaining 13.2% the majority speak English 'very well' or 'well'. Only 200 residents (13.6% of those where English is not their main language) state they cannot speak English well or at all⁸.

Apart from English, the most spoken languages in the ward are Gujurati (324 residents, 2.9%) and Portuguese (86 residents, 0.8%).

Working age breakdown (ages 16-74):

In Northwood Hills, the working age population of those in the age bracket 16-24 make up 9.6% of the ward population, whilst the 25-59 age group make up 70.7%, the remaining 19.7% are from the 60-74 age group.



In Northwood Hills, 70.9% of residents of working age are economically active. The table below provides a breakdown of economic activity in the ward when compared with Hillingdon and England:



Of those residents in employment, this chart provides an overview of the **Occupation Types**⁹ across Northwood Hills ward:



The chart below shows income deprivation being varied across Hillingdon. At ward level, the percentage of people who live in income deprived households ranges from 4.8% in Ickenham to 21.7% in Townfield. Northwood Hills is 10.5%, which is lower than the Hillingdon average (13.6%).

Households

In 2017, there were 4,967 households¹⁰ in Northwood Hills, an increase of 120 since Census 2011. The majority of **housing type**¹¹ within the ward is houses or bungalows (either detached, semi or terraced) at 70.4%, with 29.6% being flats or maisonettes (including those in a commercial building).


The diagram below shows the percentage of housing types at ward, borough and regional level.





In Northwood Hills, 67.0% of ward residents own their own homes, followed by 16.1% of properties being privately rented, 15.5% socially rented from the Council and the remaining residents make up 1.4% other (eg shared ownership, living rent free).




Household Type Northwood Hills



Health

Life expectancy is the number of years a person is expected to live on average. In Northwood Hills, the life expectancy is estimated at 80.2 years for males and 85.6 years for females. For males this is similar to Hillingdon but above England, and for females this is above Hillingdon and England.


Observed Prevalence¹²

These graphs show the recorded prevalence of long term conditions from the Quality & Outcomes Framework (QOF) 2017/18, at GP practice level. They show the calculated prevalence of patients on a GP register, recorded as having a given condition. It should be noted that patients registered in this ward do not necessarily live in the ward or the Borough.

The graphs show recorded prevalence at England, London, borough, locality and ward level. Northwood Hills ward contains two GP surgeries (Acre Surgery and Carepoint Practice).



Coronary Heart Disease prevalence, 2017/18




Atrial Fibrilation prevalence, 2017/18


Cardiovascular Disease prevalence, 2017/18

The prevalence of **heart failure** within Northwood Hills is 0.63%; this is higher than London and Hillingdon but lower than England and the locality:




Heart Failure prevalence, 2017/18

The prevalence of **hypertension** in Northwood Hills is 12.98% which is lower than England and the locality, but higher than Hillingdon and London;




Hypertension prevalence, 2017/18

The prevalence of **peripheral arterial disease** in Northwood Hills is 0.42%, which is lower than England and the locality, but higher than London and the same as Hillingdon:




Peripheral Arterial Disease prevalence, 2017/18

The prevalence of **stroke / transient ischaemic attack (TIA)** is 1.10%, which is lower than England, Hillingdon and the locality and then same as London:





Asthma prevalence, 2017/18



COPD prevalence, 2017/18




Dementia prevalence, 2017/18




Depression prevalence, 2017/18



Learning Disabilities prevalence, 2017/18



Mental Health prevalence, 2017/18




Cancer prevalence, 2017/18



Diabetes prevalence, 2017/18



Palliative Care prevalance, 2017/18





Estimated prevalence of Diagnosed Hypertension Northwood Hills, 2015




Undiagnosed Hypertension


Estimated prevalence of Undiagnosed Hypertension Northwood Hills, 2015








Estimated prevalence of Stroke
