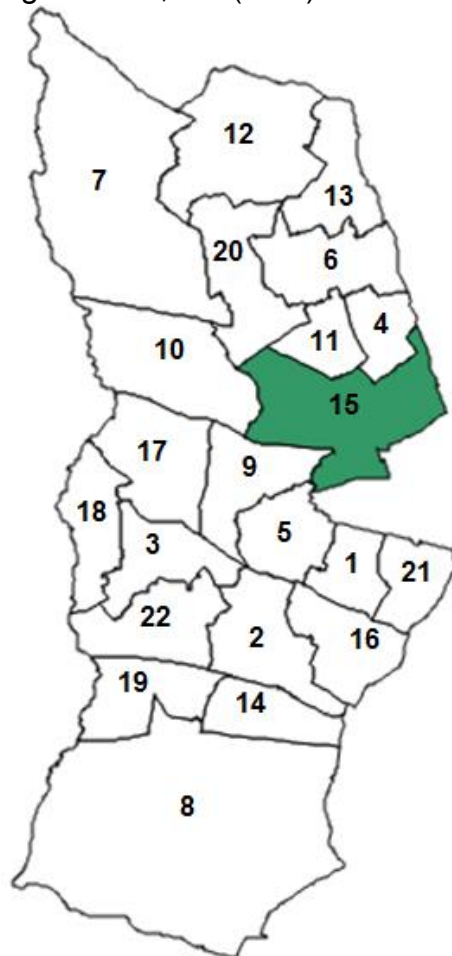

Hillingdon at a glance, 2017

- **Population** – comparing the 2011 Census figures with those with GLA Interim 2015-based population projections, the borough's population in 2017 has increased by approximately 10.9% (from 273,936 to 303,870); by comparison London's population has increased by 8.5%. Over half of Hillingdon's 44.6 square miles is a mosaic of countryside including canals, rivers, parks and woodland. Hillingdon has an average of 25.9 people per hectare; this is the third lowest population density among London boroughs.
- **Gender** – 152,246 of borough residents are male and 151,624 are female.
- **Age** – 21.7% of the borough population is under 16, 6.1% over 75 and 72.1% aged 16-74 (this is defined as working age).
- **Ethnicity** - Hillingdon's White British population decreased from 73% in the 2001 Census to 52% in the 2011 Census; Hillingdon's BAME population increased from 27% to 48% in the same period. Current data (from the Greater London Authority 2015 Round Trend-based Ethnic Group Population Projections) shows that Hillingdon's White British population in 2017 is 43% and the BAME population is 57%.
- **Religion¹** - the predominant religions in the borough at 2011 are Christian – 134,813 (49.2%), Muslim – 29,065 (10.6%), Hindu – 22,033 (8%) and Sikh – 18,230 (6.7%), we also have a large percentage of residents stating 'no religion' – 46,492 (17%) and other – 23,303 (8.5%).

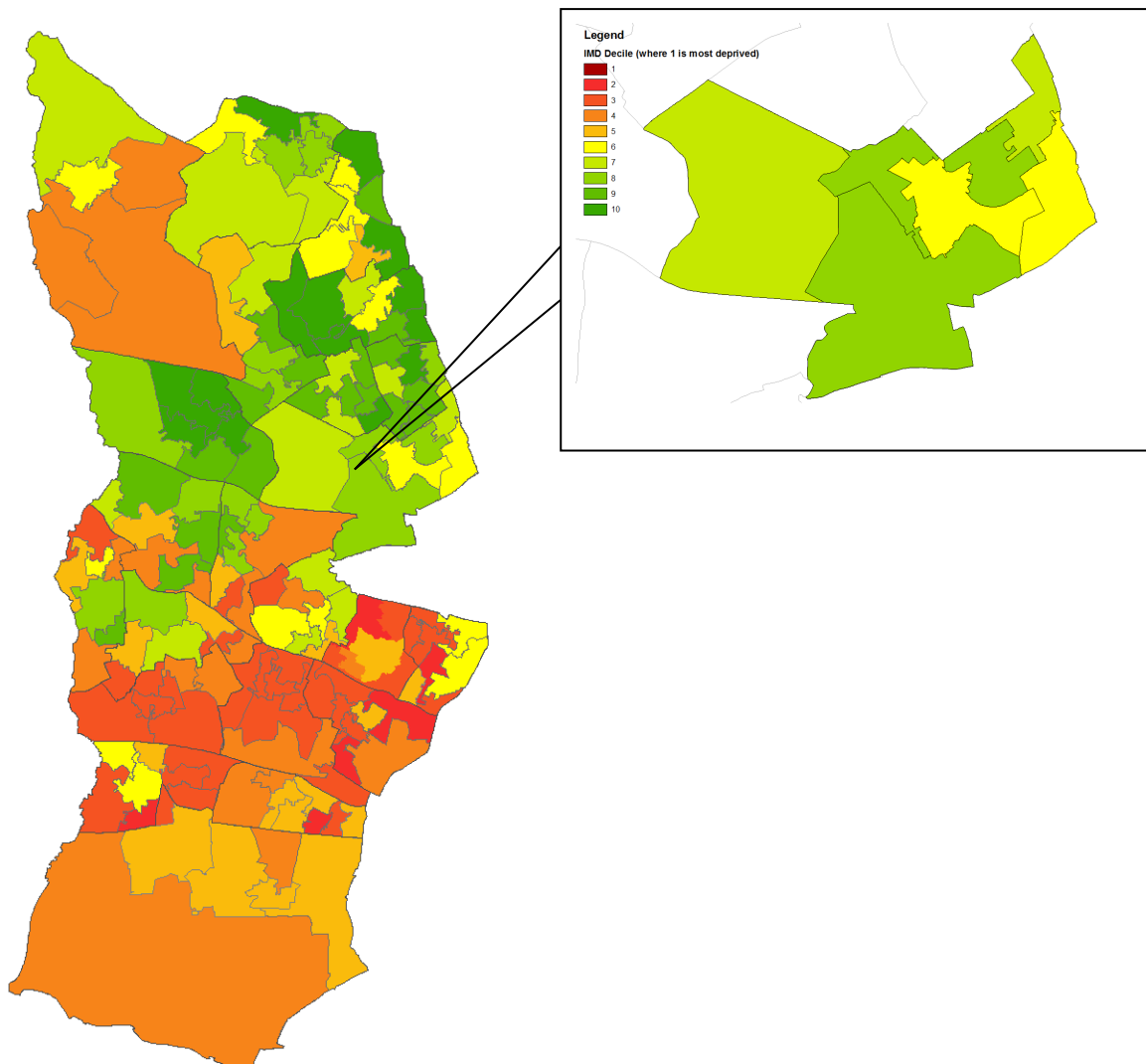
South Ruislip Ward

South Ruislip lies in the north of Hillingdon and is bordered by Cavendish, Manor, West Ruislip, Ickenham and Hillingdon East, as well as the London Boroughs of Harrow and Ealing.

In 2017², South Ruislip's population is 13,150 residents, an increase of 6.4% since 2011 (12,364); this is lower than the 10.9% increase for Hillingdon overall. South Ruislip is made up of 741.1 hectares (7.4 km^{sq}), with 17.7 people per hectare (1,774 per km^{sq}). The average number of people per household is 2.5³.

Deprivation

The 2015 Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) calculate local measures of deprivation and indicates where each small area is ranked in relation to the whole of England. The map below shows patterns of deprivation within South Ruislip, which is made up of seven LSOAs⁴.

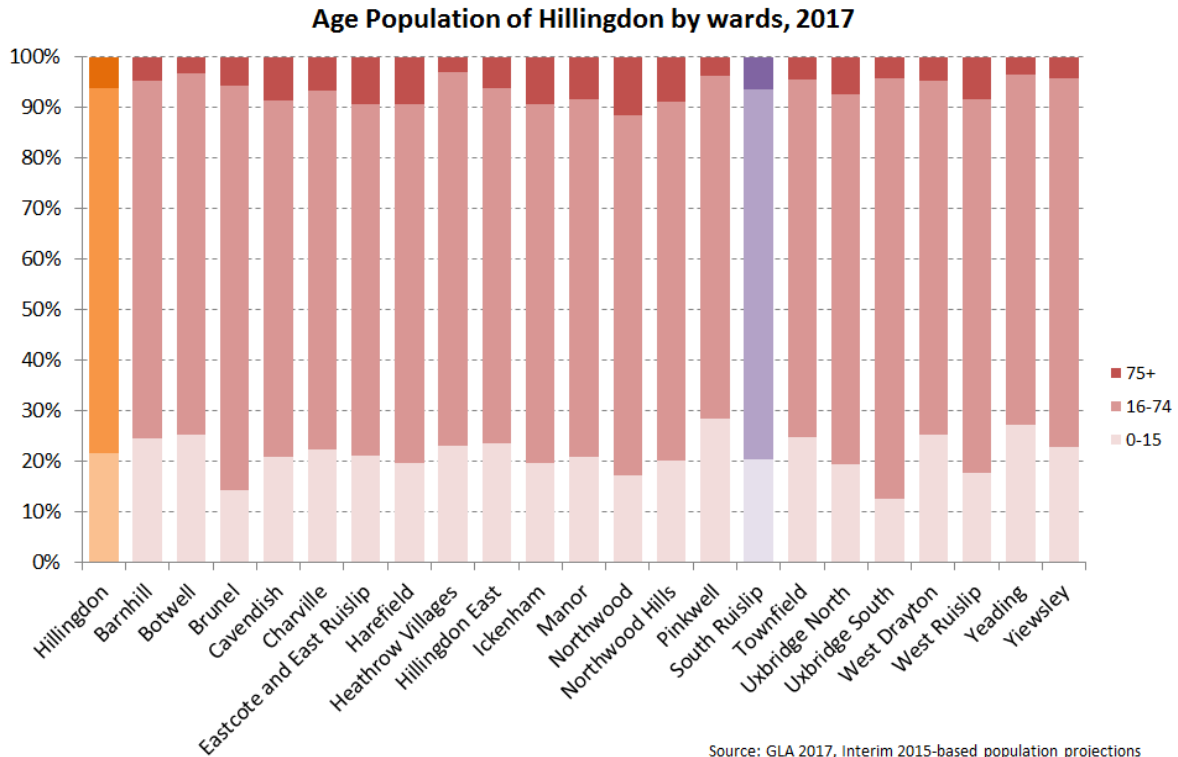

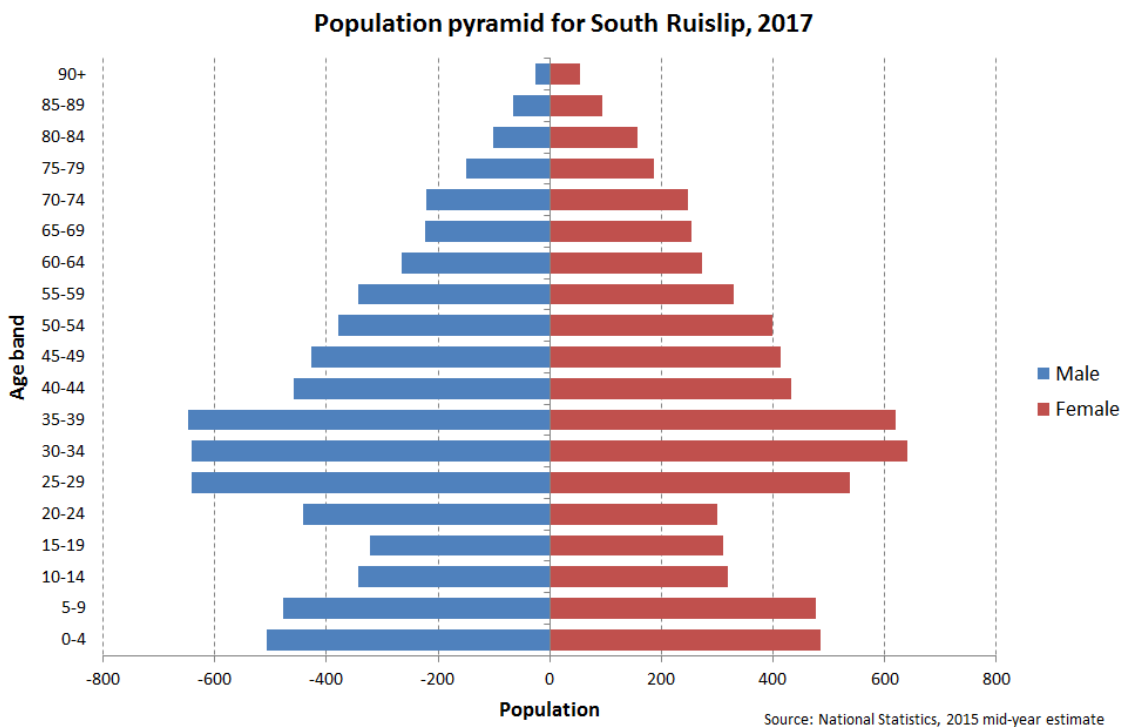

Ward Population:



The chart above shows that 20.4% of South Ruislip residents are under the age of 16. 73.3% of residents fall into the working age bracket (defined as a resident aged between 16 and 74) and the remaining 6.3% are over the age of 75.

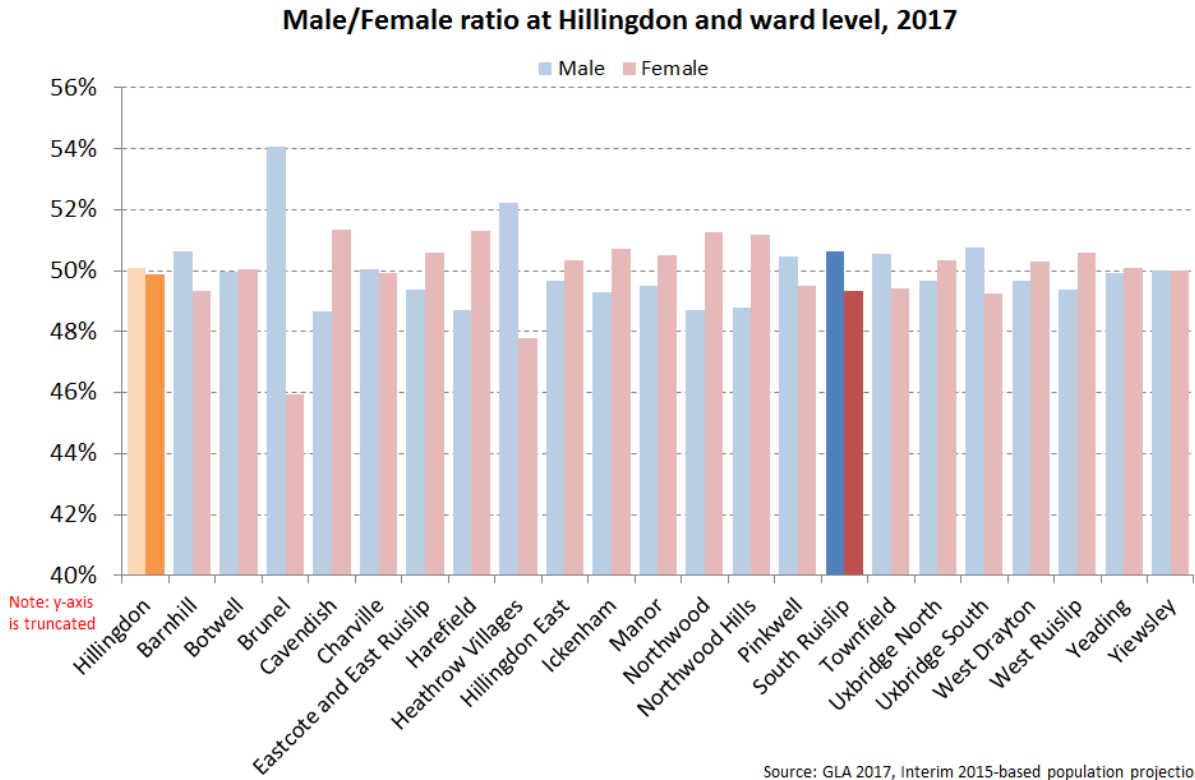
The chart below shows that in South Ruislip, there are higher numbers of males and females in the 30-34 and 35-39 age brackets when compared to other age groups.



Gender

The proportion of **men to women** in the ward is 50.7% to 49.3%. This is a small change from 2011 when there was a 49.6% to 50.4% male to female ratio in the ward.

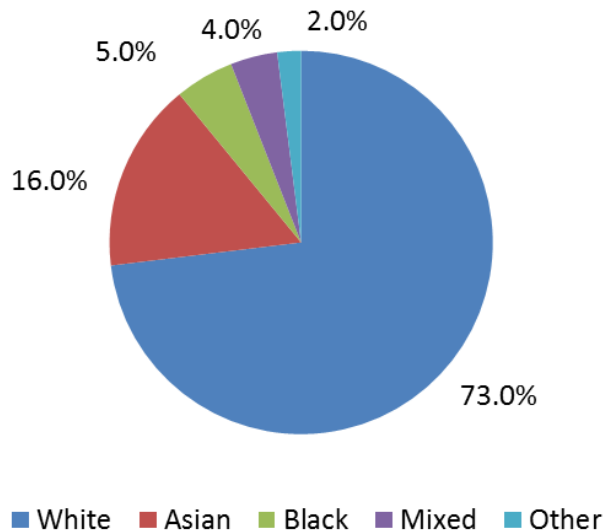
The chart below shows male/female ratios in Hillingdon and ward level:



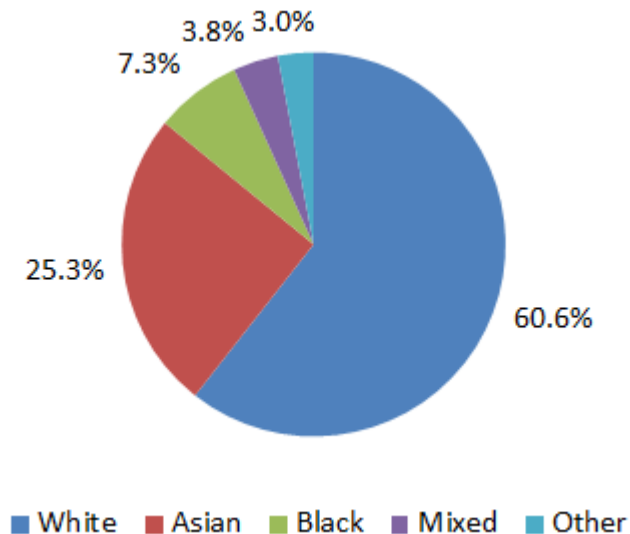
Ethnic make up 2011⁵

In the 2011 census, 73% of South Ruislip residents identified themselves as White British background (this includes English, Northern Irish, Scottish, Welsh, Irish, Gypsy or Irish Traveller and Other White). 4% from Mixed / Multiple Ethnic groups, 16% from Asian / Asian British background (including Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi and Chinese), 5% from Black / African / Caribbean / Black British backgrounds and 2% from other ethnic backgrounds (including Arab).

Hillingdon, Ethnic makeup 2011:



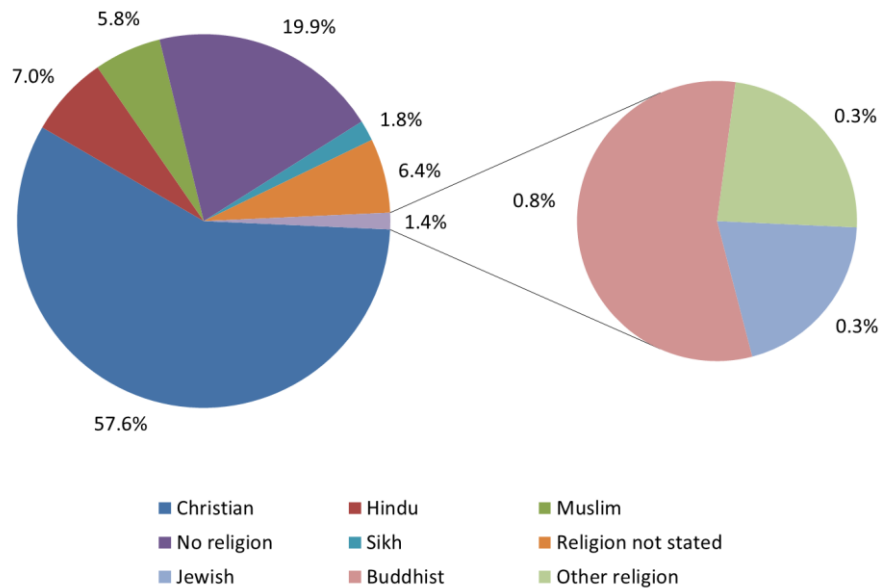

Religion⁶

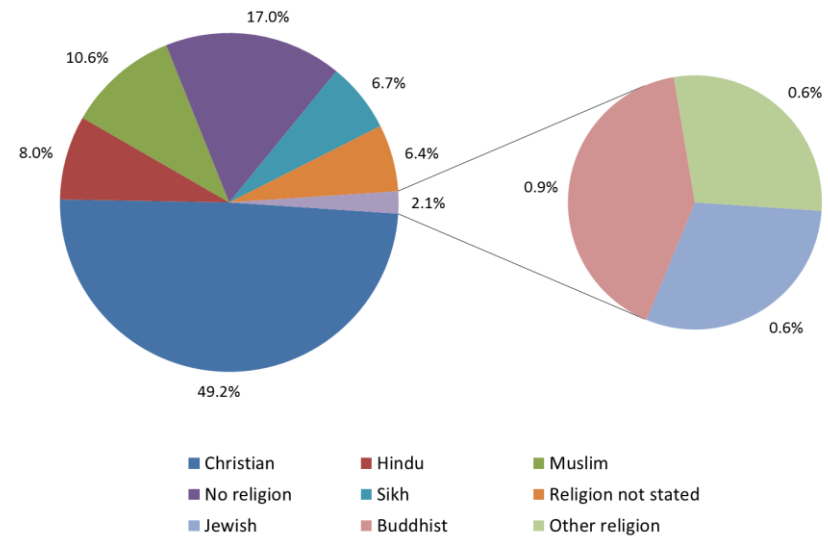
Christianity is the predominant religion in the ward with 57.6% from this faith. 7.0% are Hindu, 5.8% are Muslim and 19.9% have no religion. 6.4% chose not to state a religion (the question was voluntary).

Hillingdon, Religion 2011:

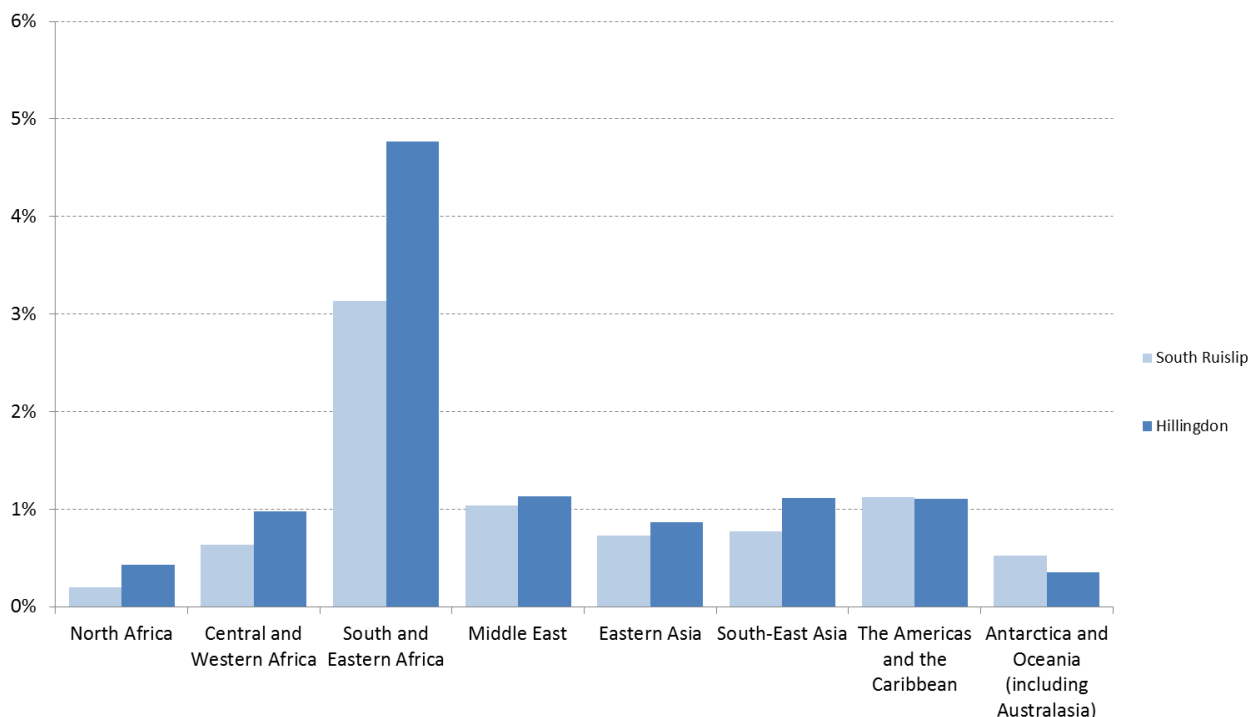

Country of Birth⁷

Of those living in South Ruislip, 85.7% were **born** in Europe (with 76.8% in the UK), 8.4% in the Middle East / Asia, 4.1% in Africa, and 1.9% in the Americas, Caribbean or Australasia. In South Ruislip 23.2% were **born** outside of the UK (with 76.8% in the UK).

The preferred **language** in the ward is English with 86.9% residents stating this as their main language; of the remaining 13.1% the majority speak English 'very well' or 'well'. Only 244 residents (15.8% of those with English not as their main language) state they cannot speak English well or at all⁸.

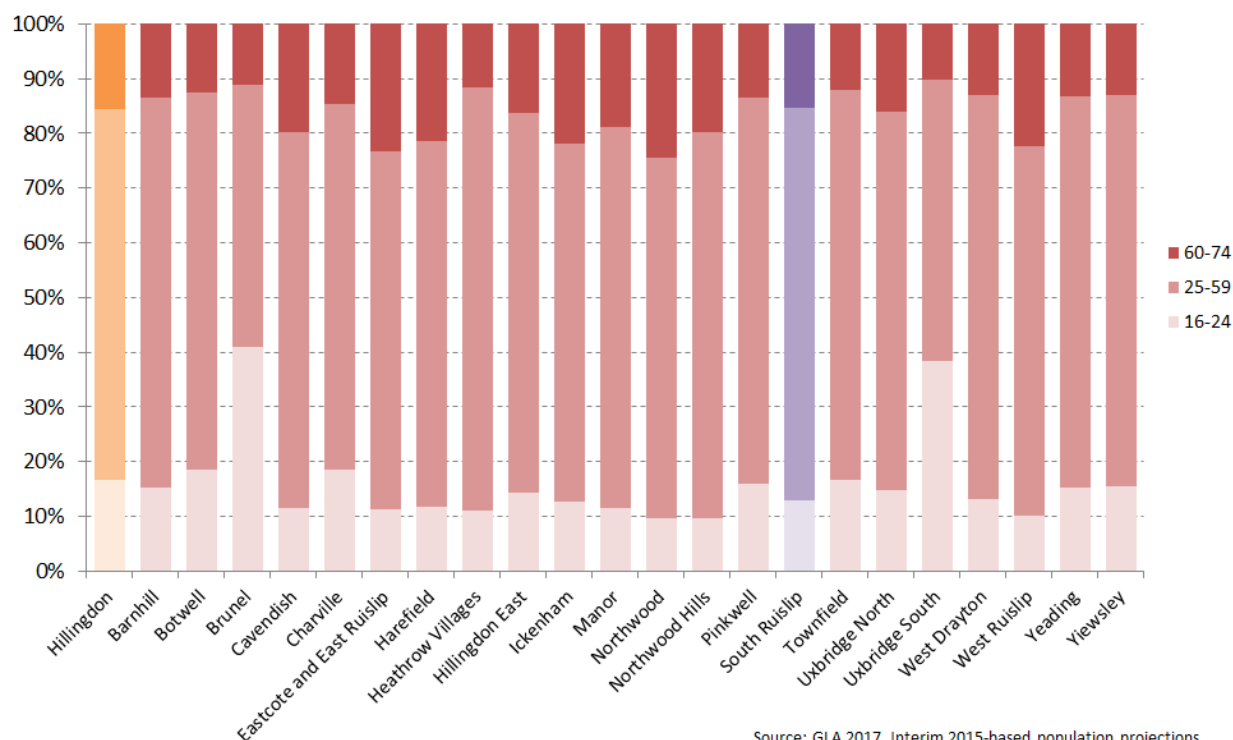
Apart from English, the most spoken languages in the ward are Gujarati (211 residents, 1.8%) and Polish (284 residents, 2.4%).

In South Ruislip, the working age population of those in the age bracket 16-24 make up 13.0% of the ward population, whilst the 25-59 age group make up 71.6%, the remaining 15.4% are from the 60-74 age group.

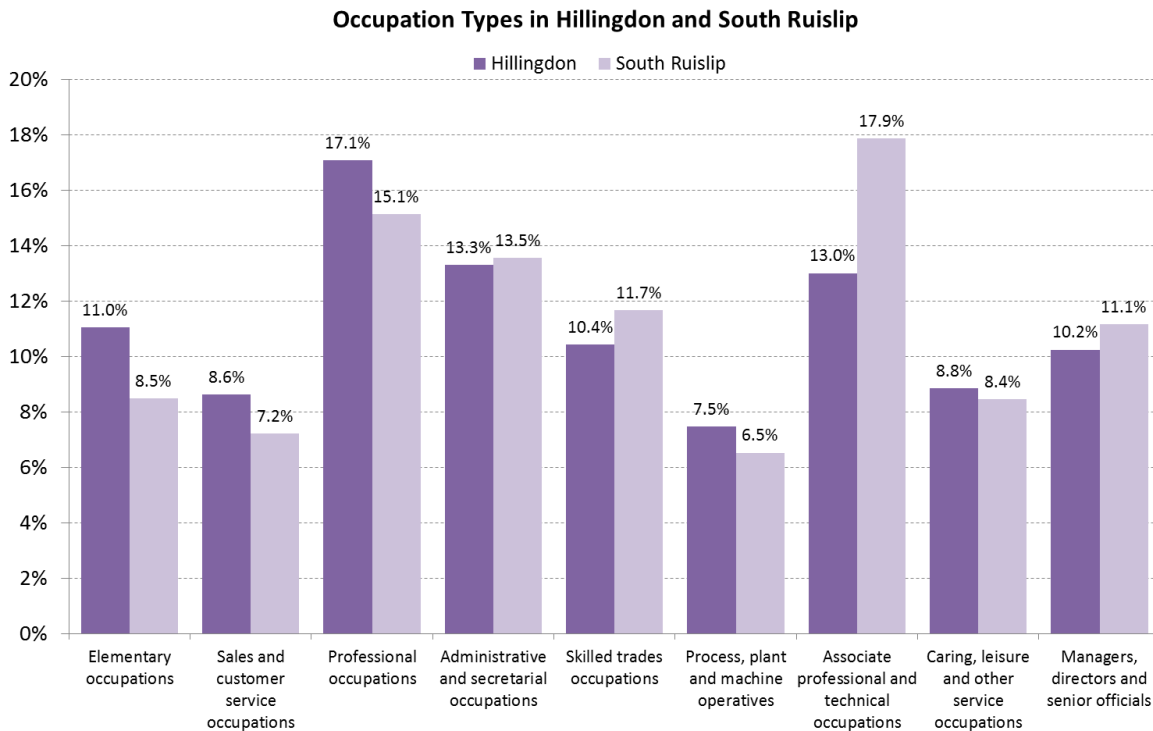

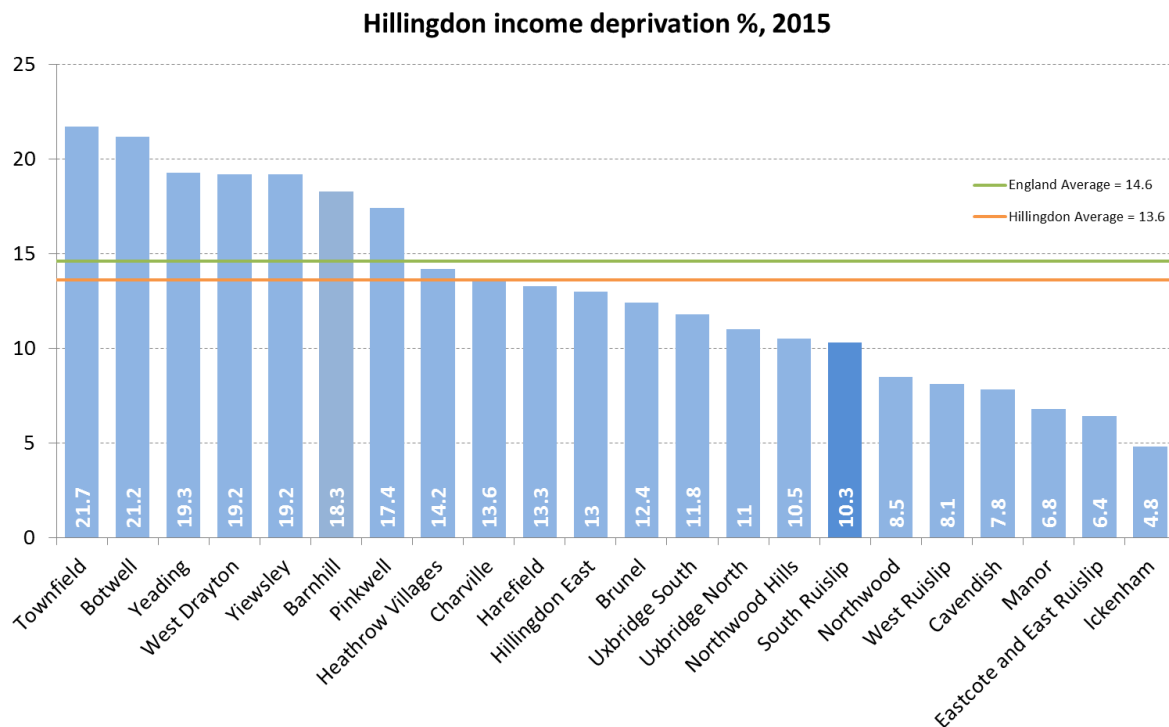

The chart below shows income deprivation being varied across Hillingdon. At ward level, the percentage of people who live in income deprived households ranges from 4.8% in Ickenham to 21.7% in Townfield. South Ruislip is 10.3%, which is lower than the Hillingdon average (13.6%).

Households

In 2017, there were 5,063 households¹⁰ in South Ruislip, an increase of 261 since Census 2011. The majority of **housing type**¹¹ within the ward is houses or bungalows (either detached, semi or terraced) at 73.4%, with 26.6% being flats or maisonettes (including those in a commercial building).

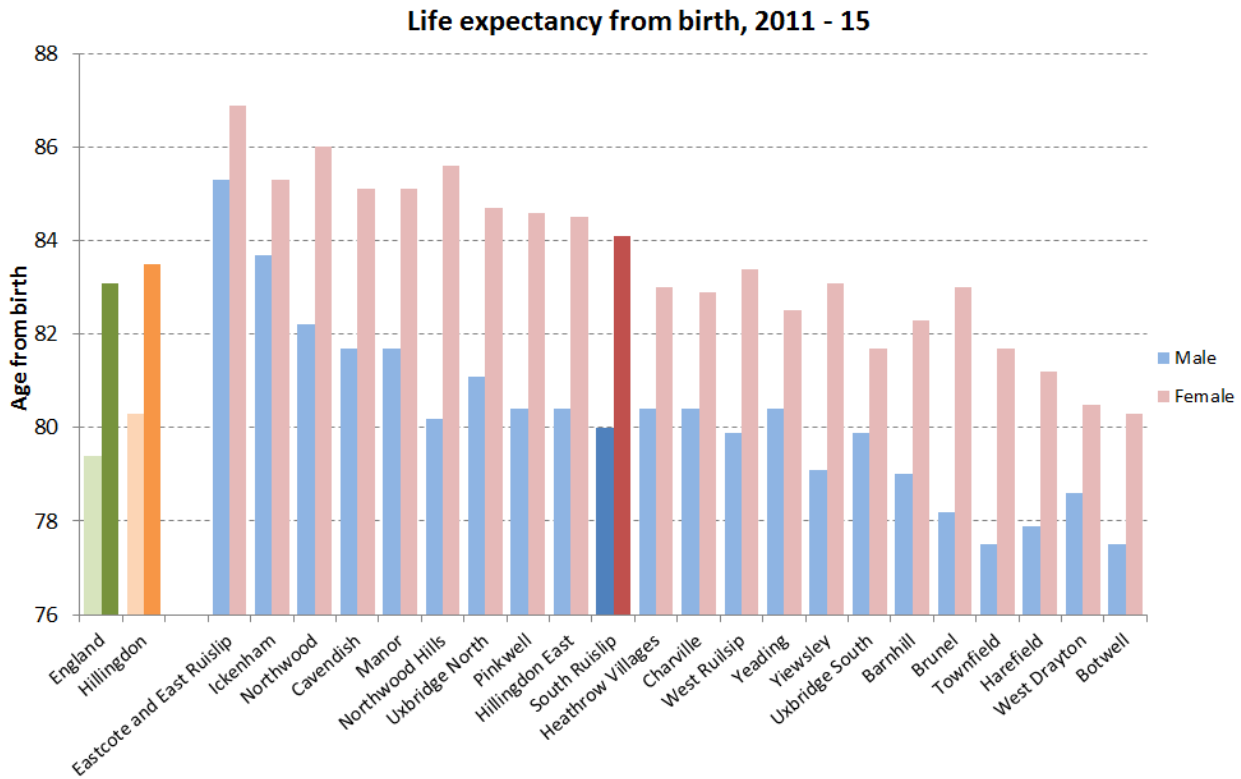
In South Ruislip, 69.4% of ward residents own their own homes, followed by 19.0% of properties being privately rented, 10.1% socially rented from the Council and the remaining residents make up 1.5% other (eg shared ownership, living rent free).

Health

Life expectancy is the number of years a person is expected to live on average. In South Ruislip, the life expectancy is estimated at 80.0 years for males and 84.1 years for females. This is below the averages for Hillingdon but above England.



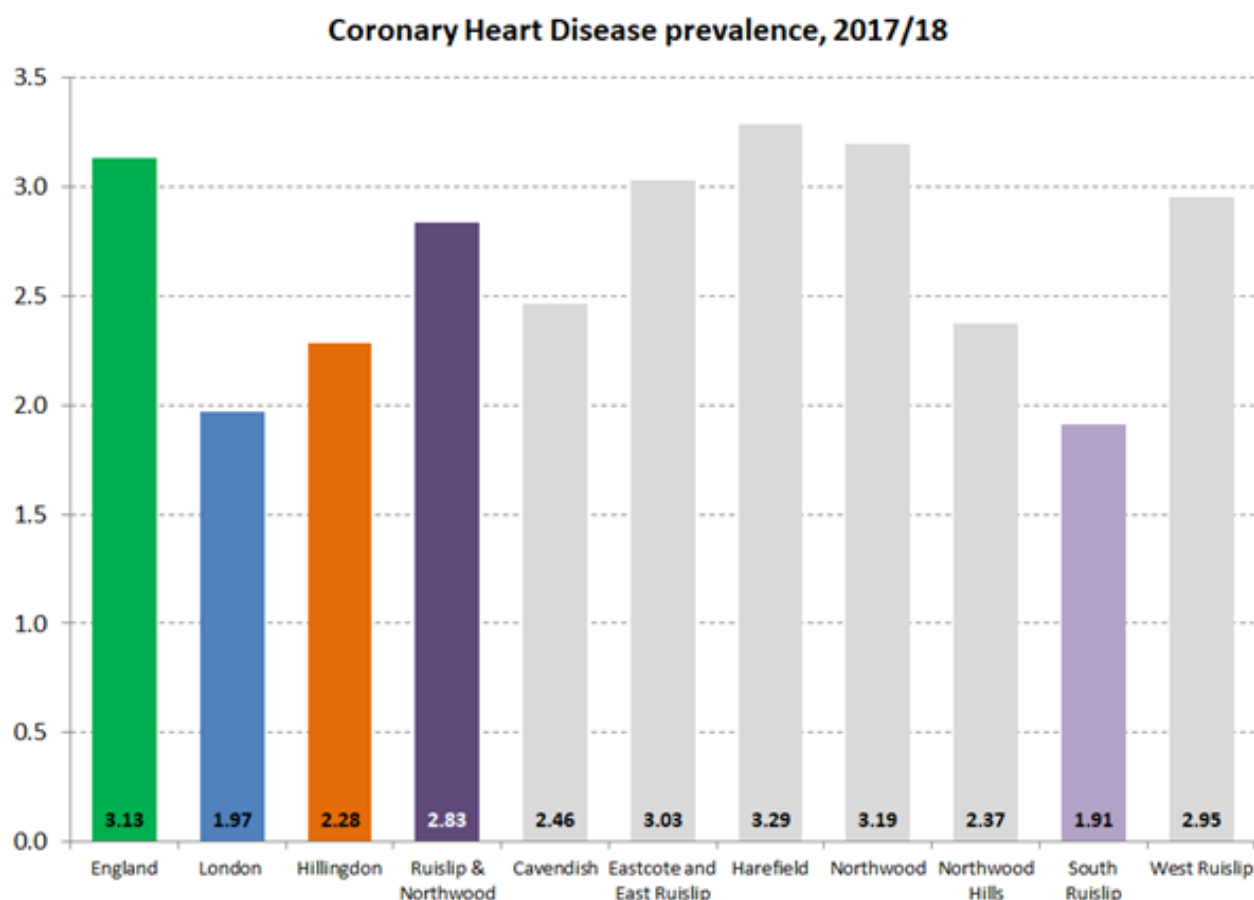
Observed Prevalence¹²

These graphs show the recorded prevalence of long term conditions from the Quality & Outcomes Framework (QOF) 2017/18, at GP practice level. They show the calculated prevalence of patients on a GP register, recorded as having a given condition. It should be noted that patients registered in this ward do not necessarily live in the ward or the Borough.

The graphs show recorded prevalence at England, London, borough, locality and ward level. South Ruislip ward contains two GP surgeries (Acrefield and Walnut Way).

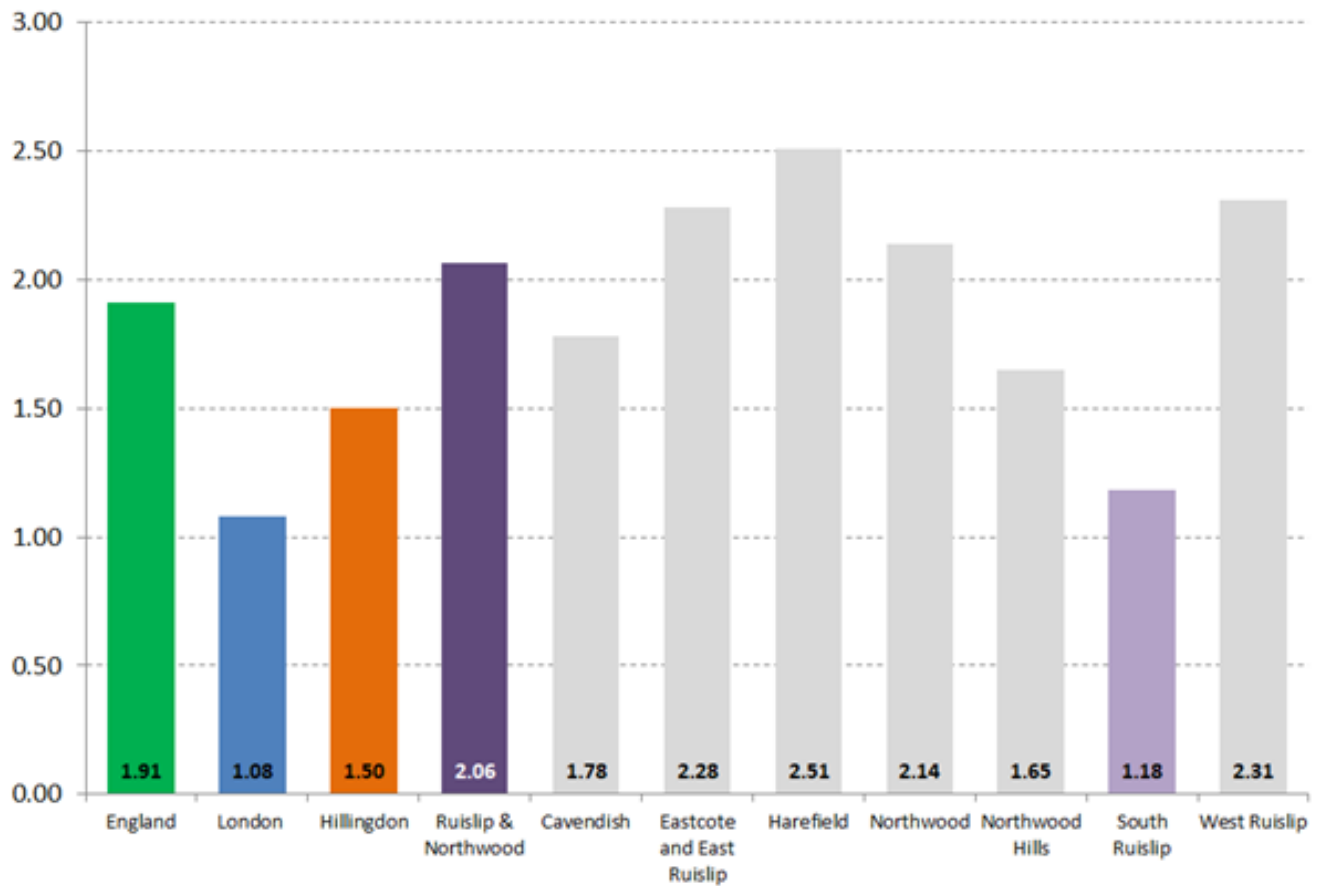

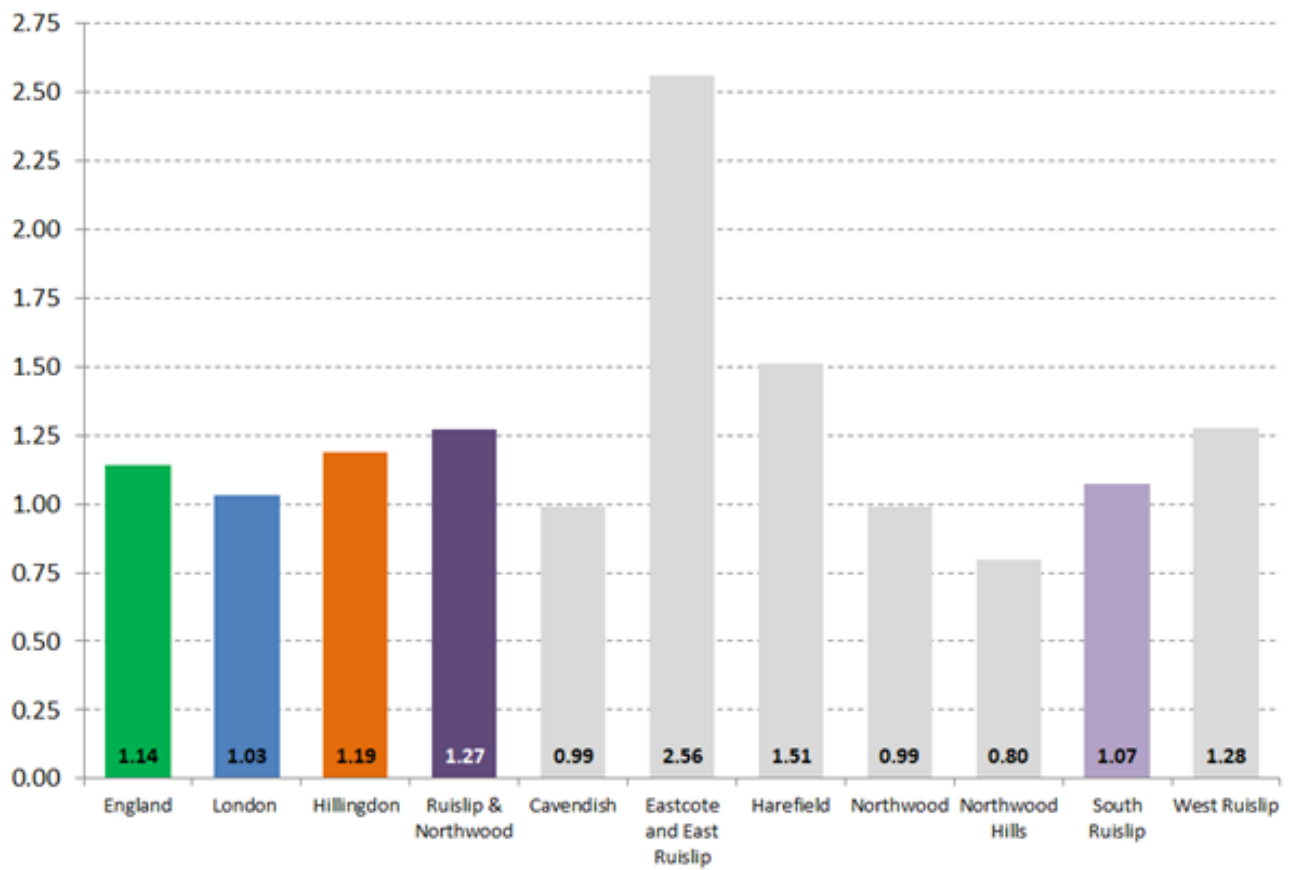

Atrial Fibrillation prevalence, 2017/18



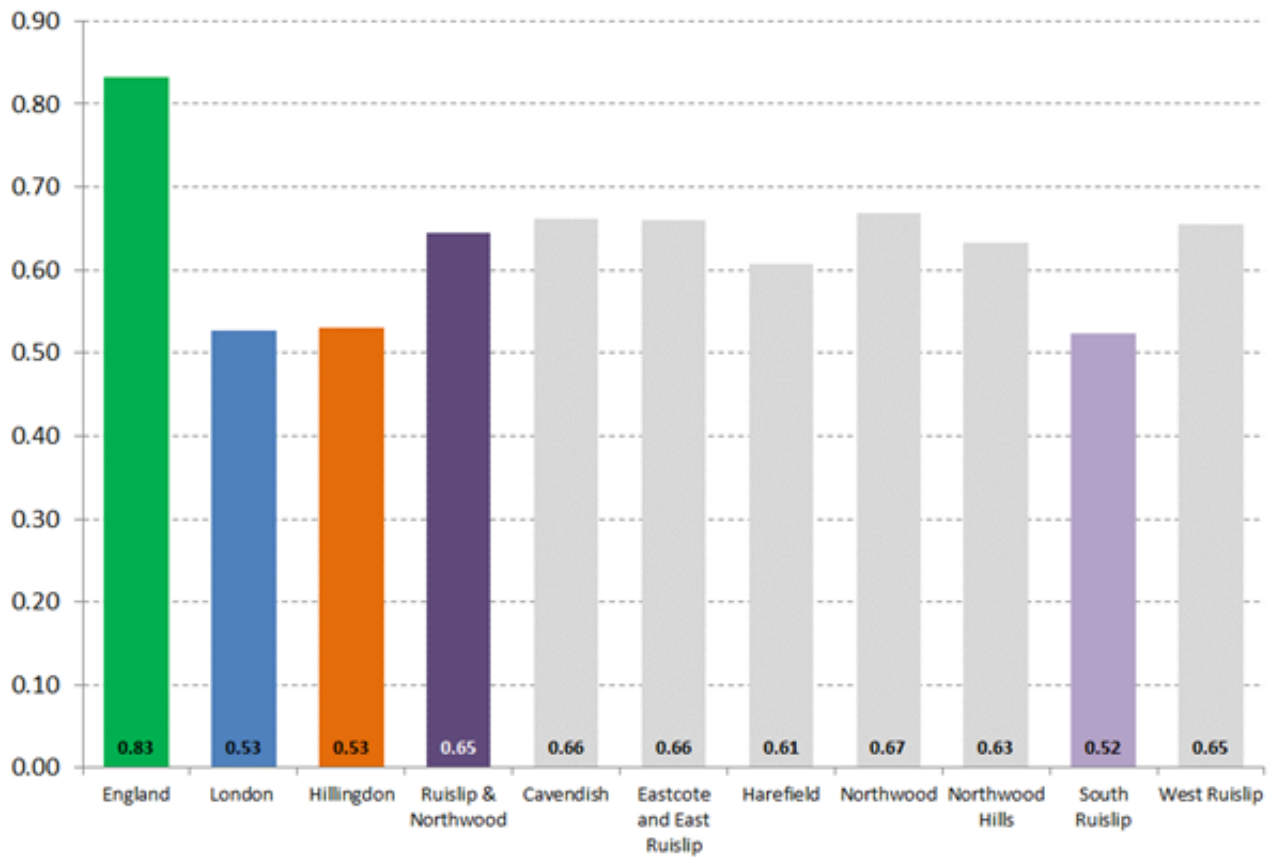

Cardiovascular Disease prevalence, 2017/18



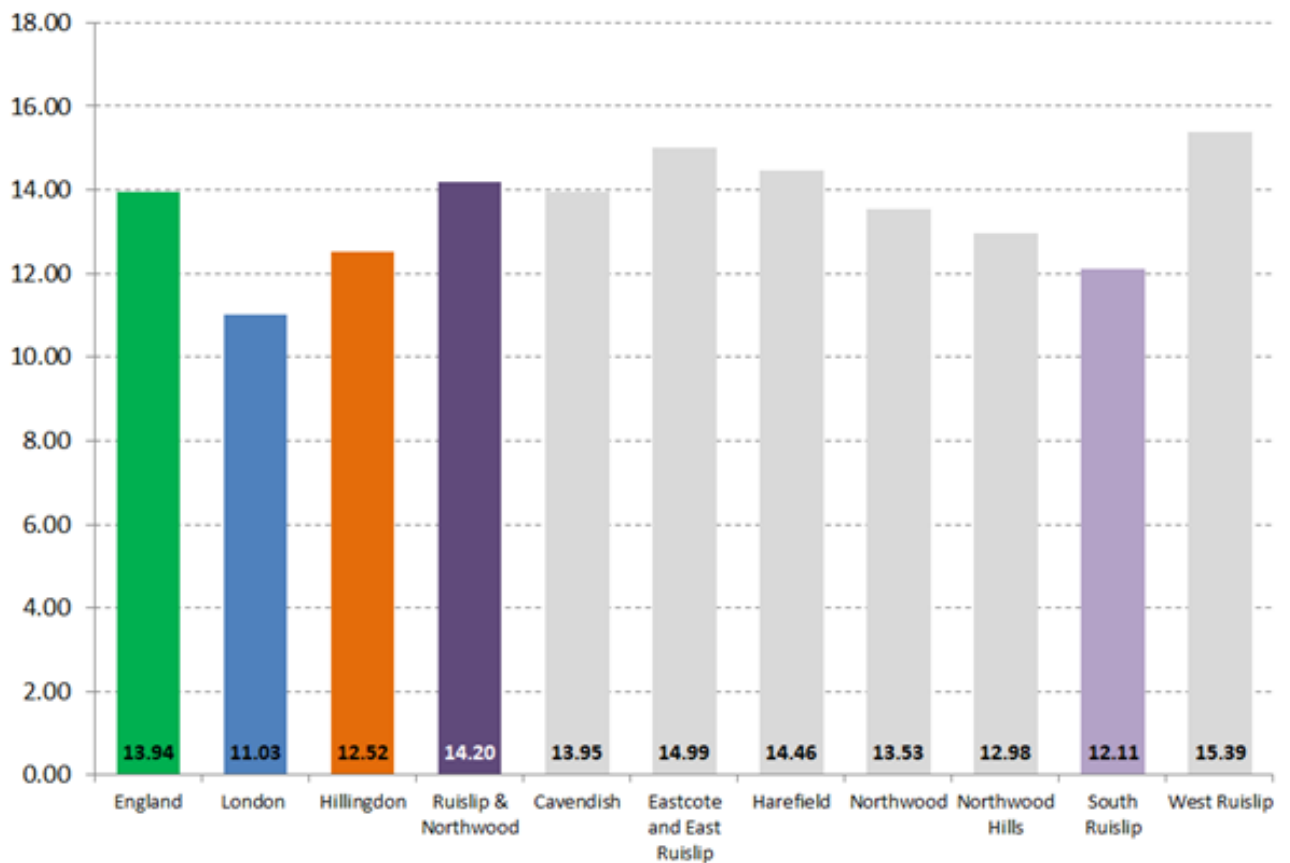

Heart Failure prevalence, 2017/18



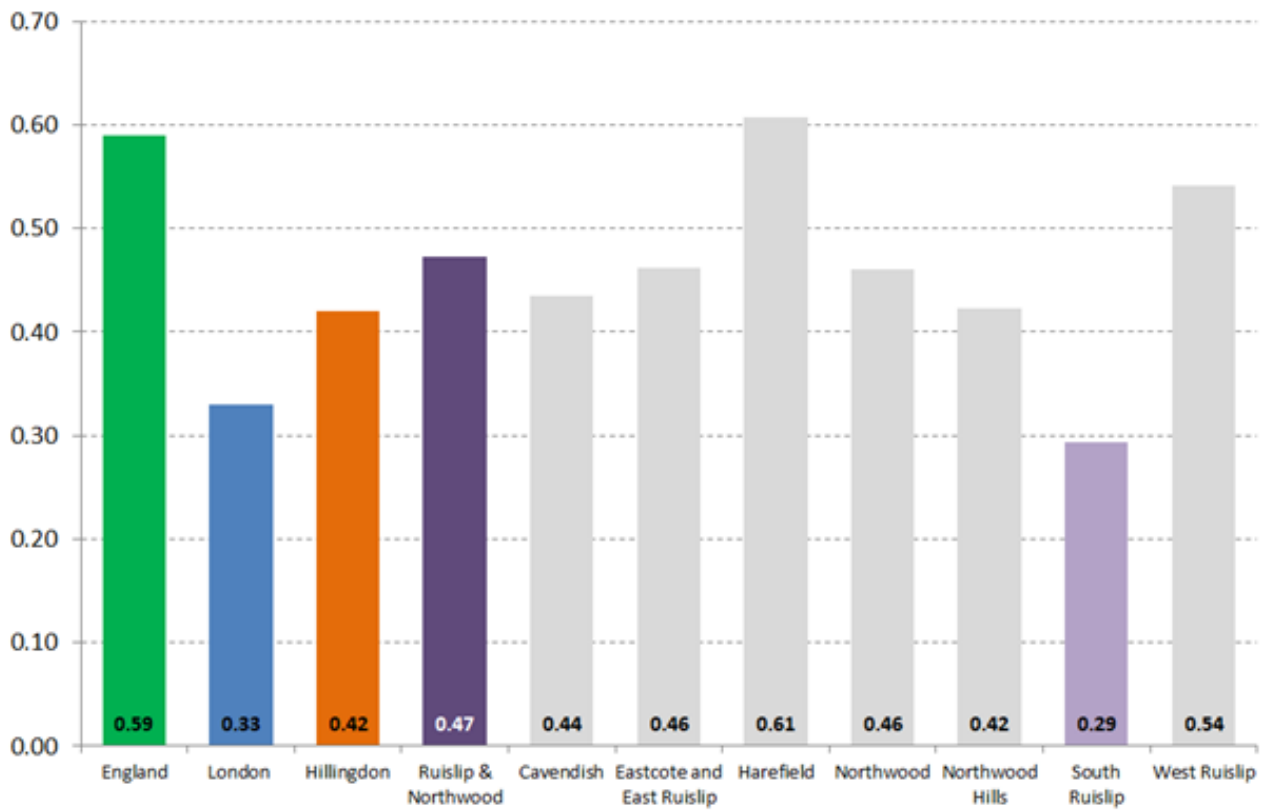

Hypertension prevalence, 2017/18



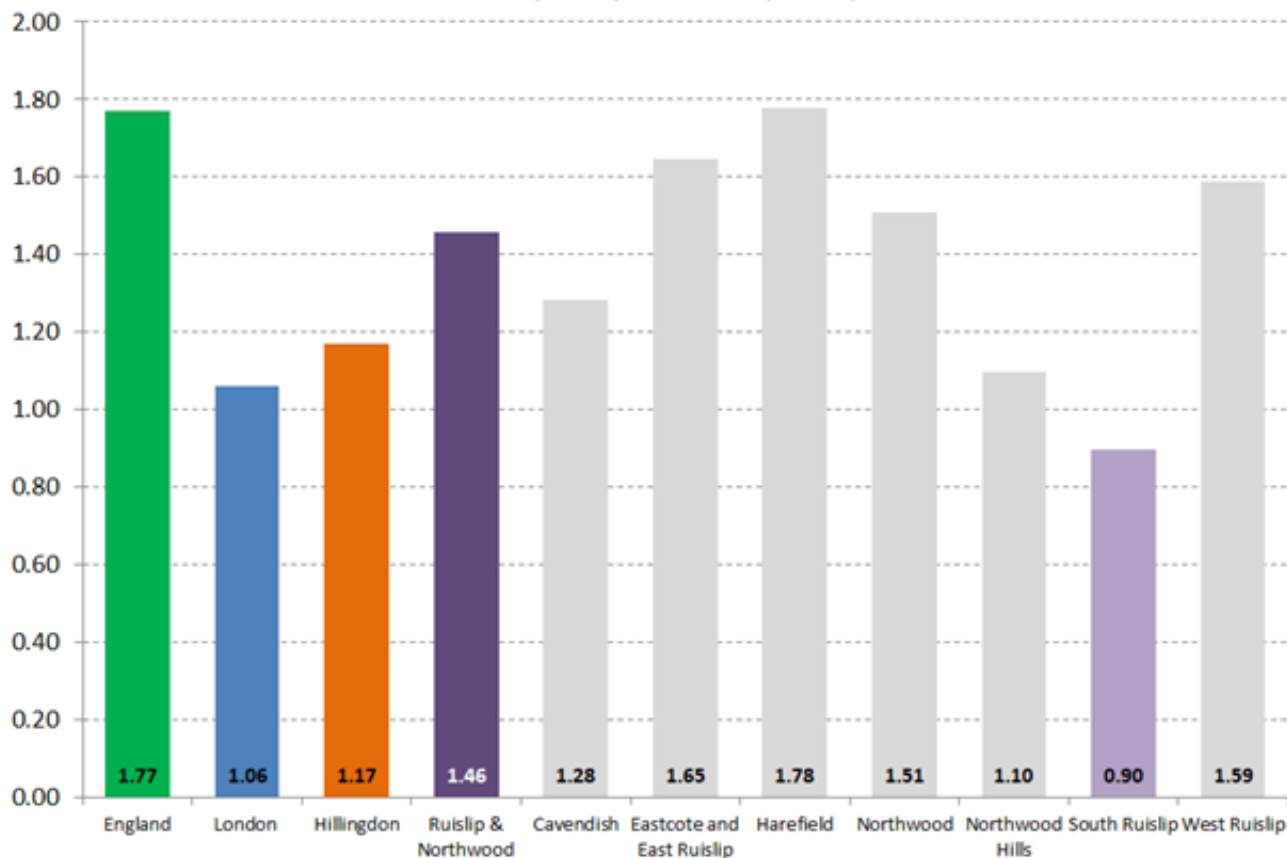

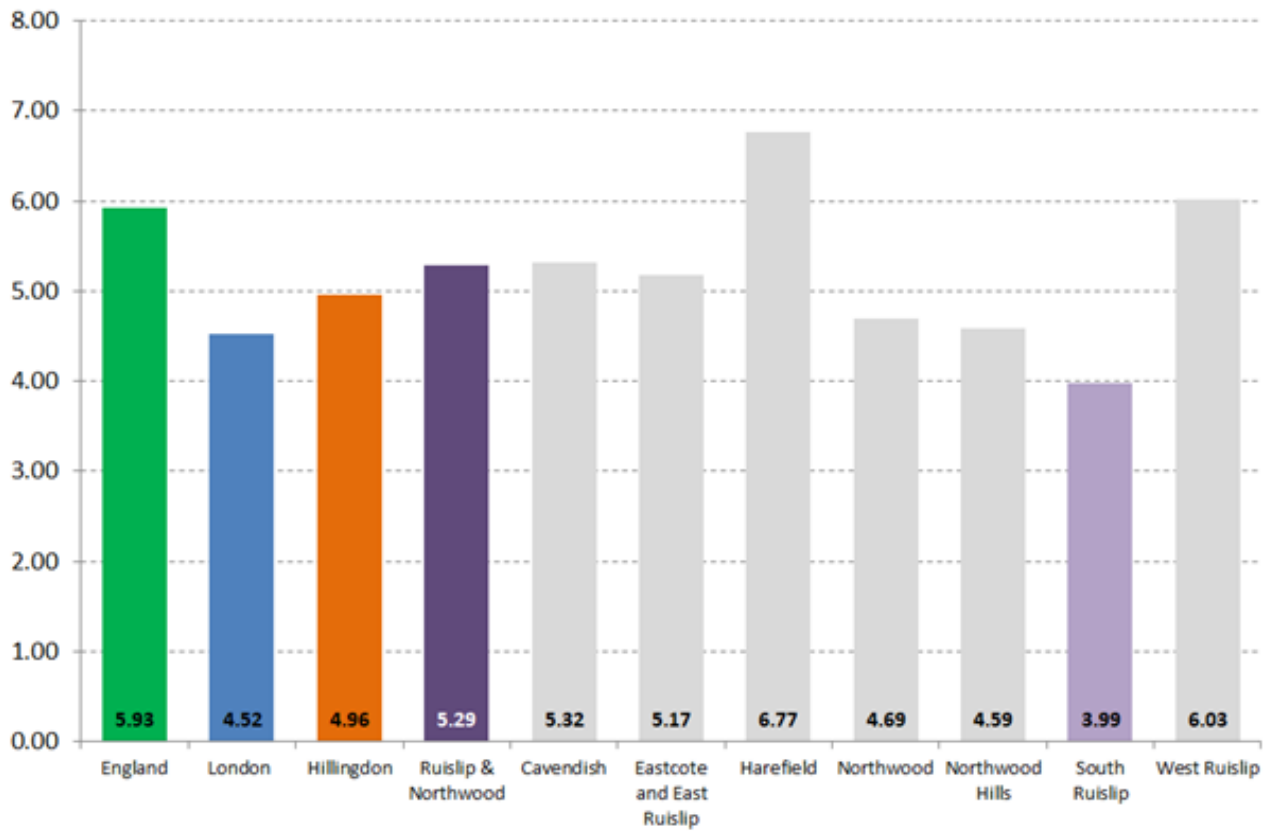
Stroke / TIA prevalence, 2017/18

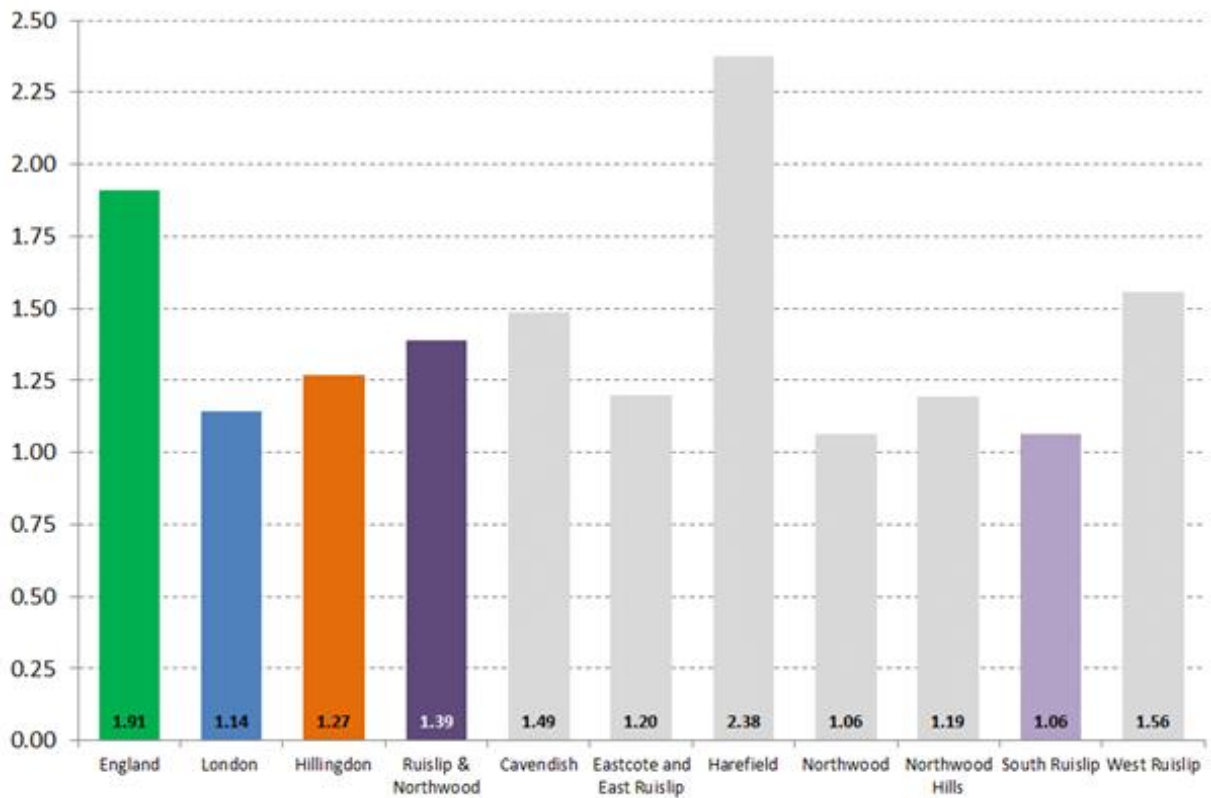

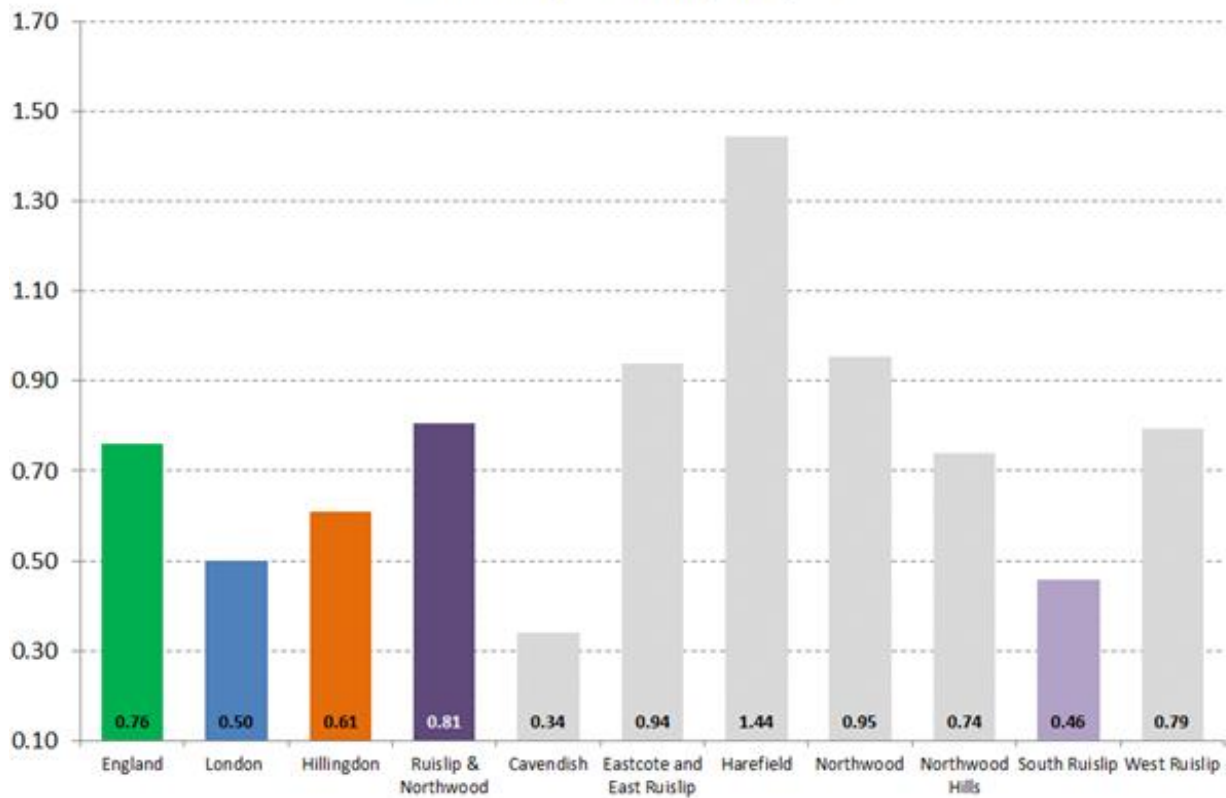
COPD prevalence, 2017/18

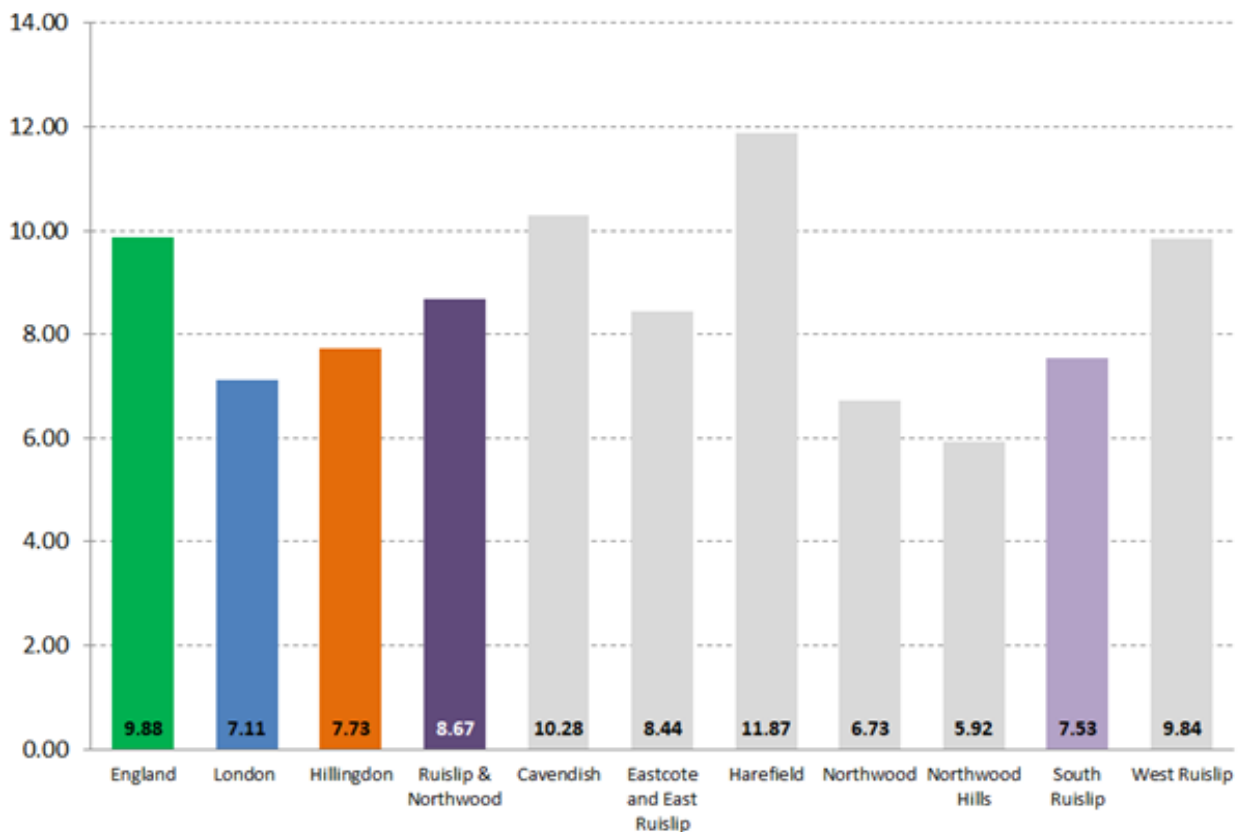

Dementia prevalence, 2017/18

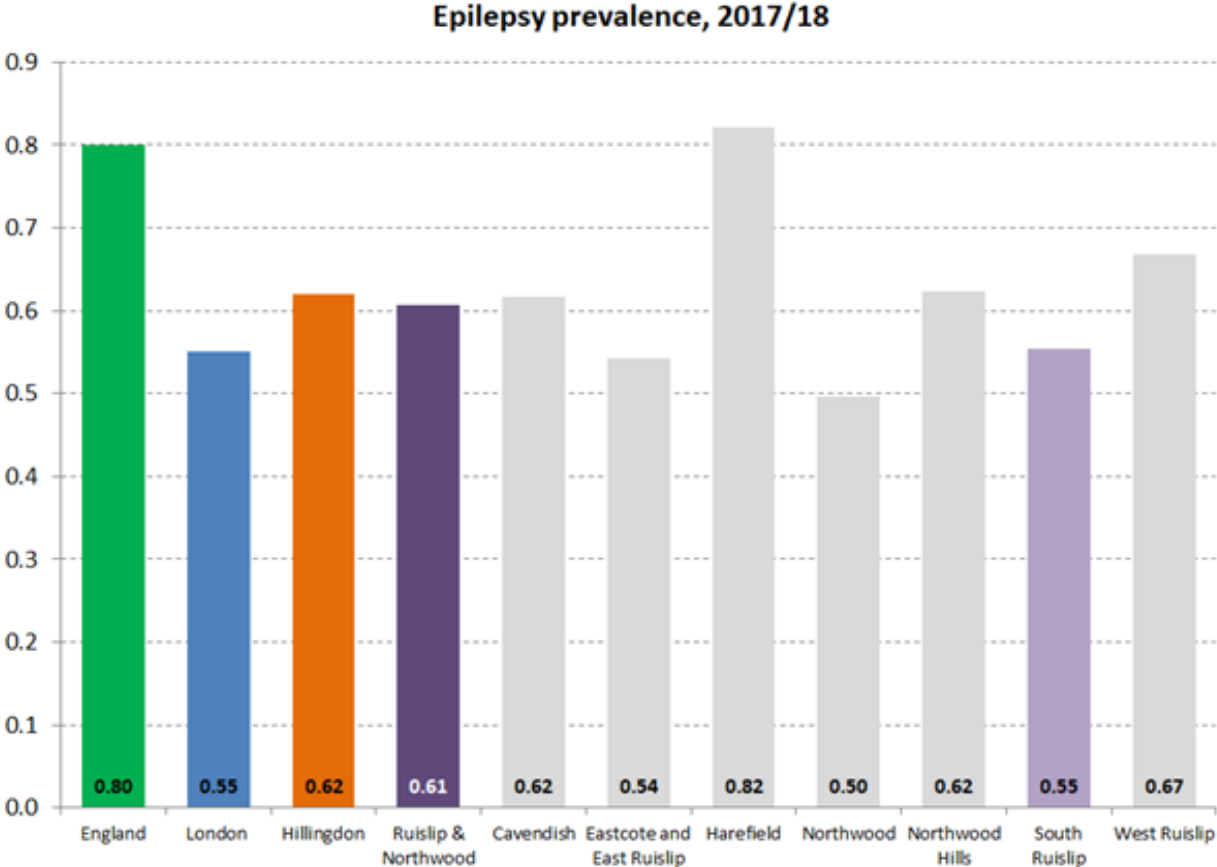

Depression prevalence, 2017/18

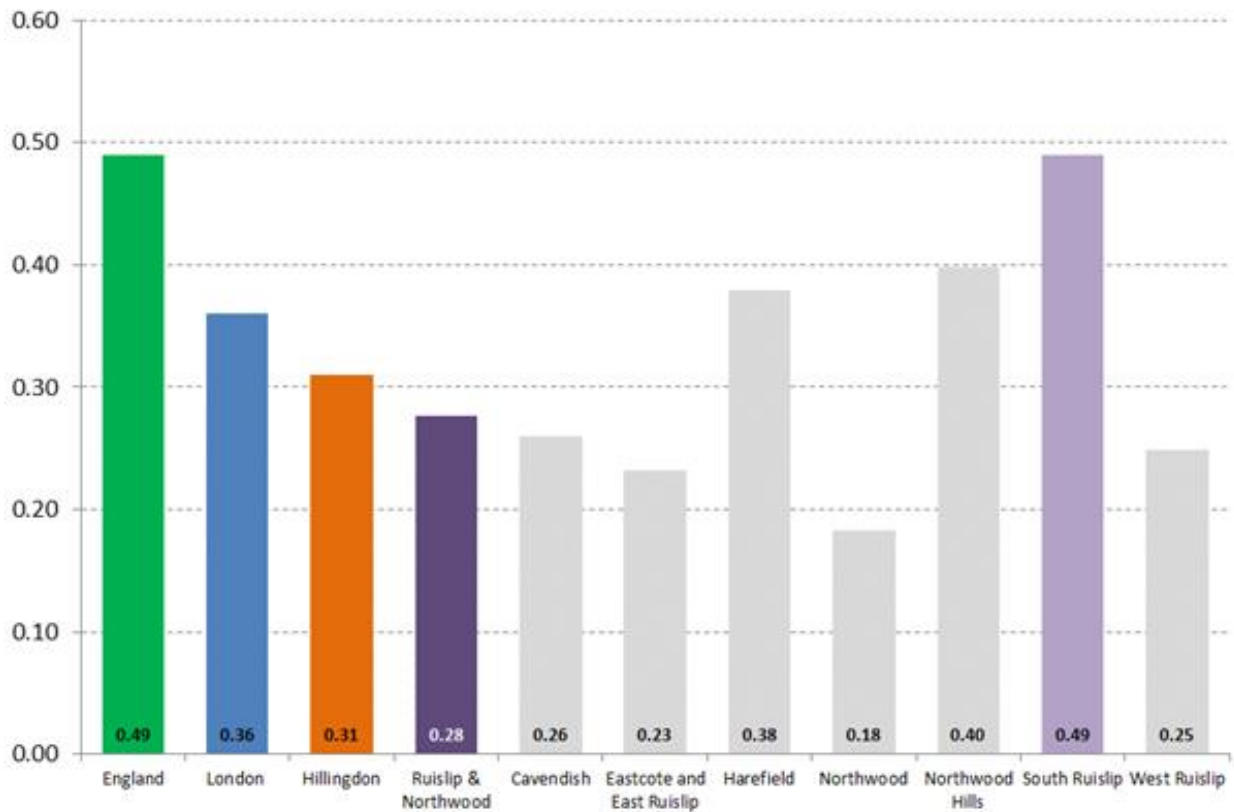

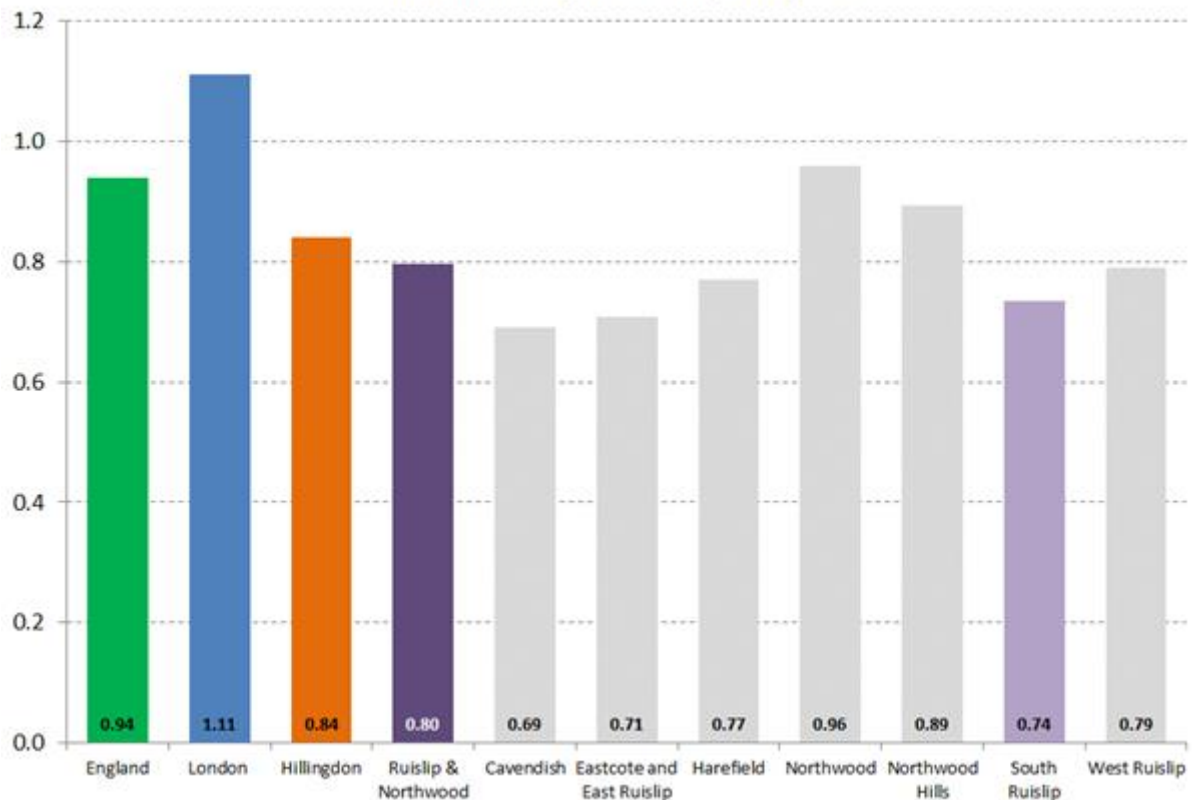

Learning Disabilities prevalence, 2017/18



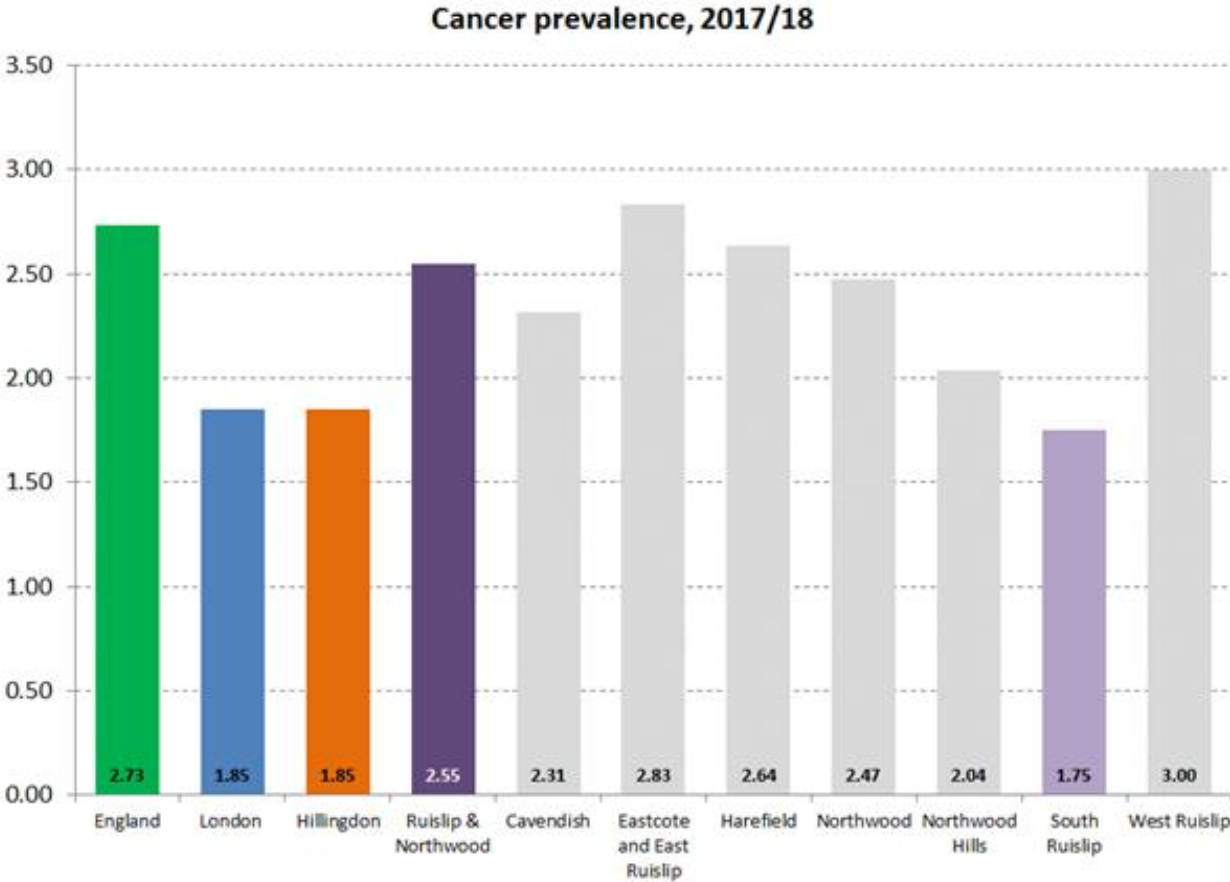

Mental Health prevalence, 2017/18



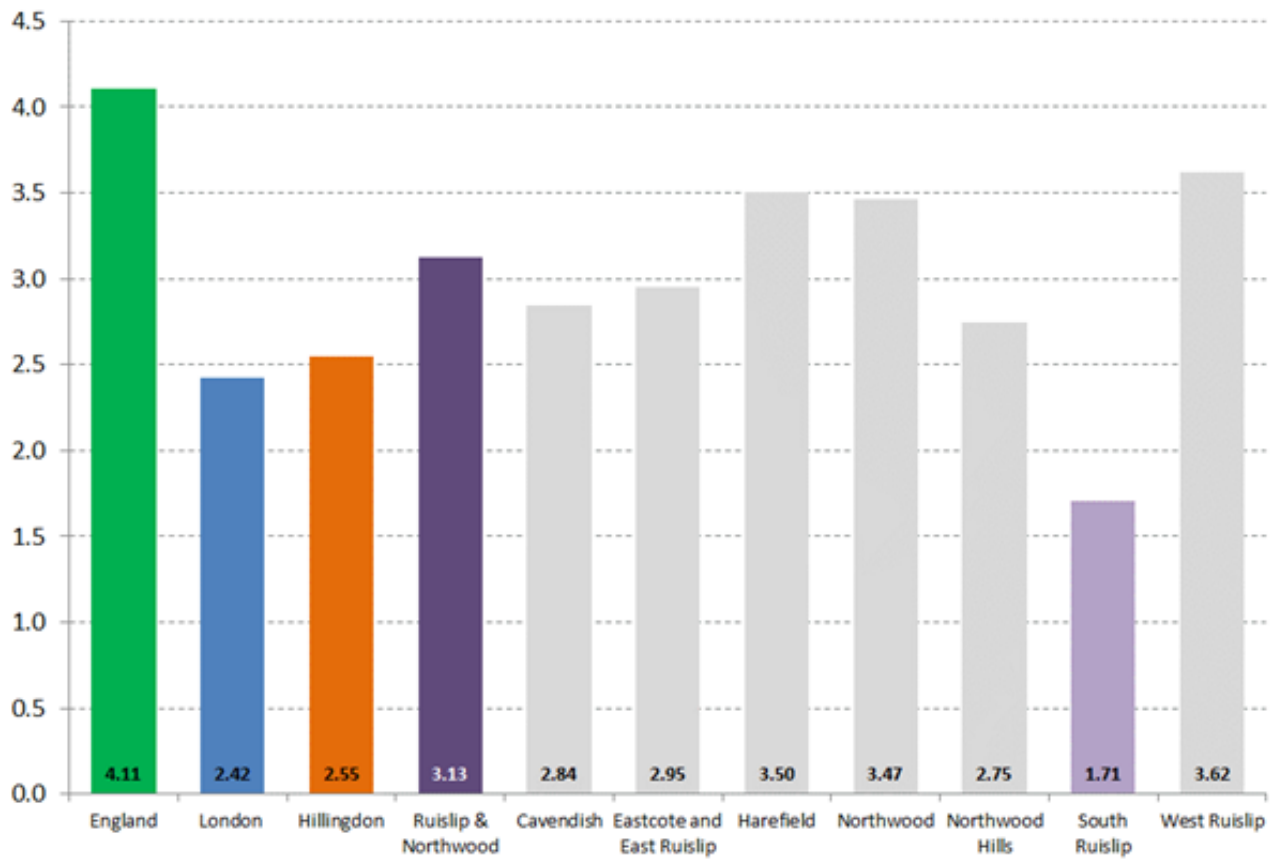

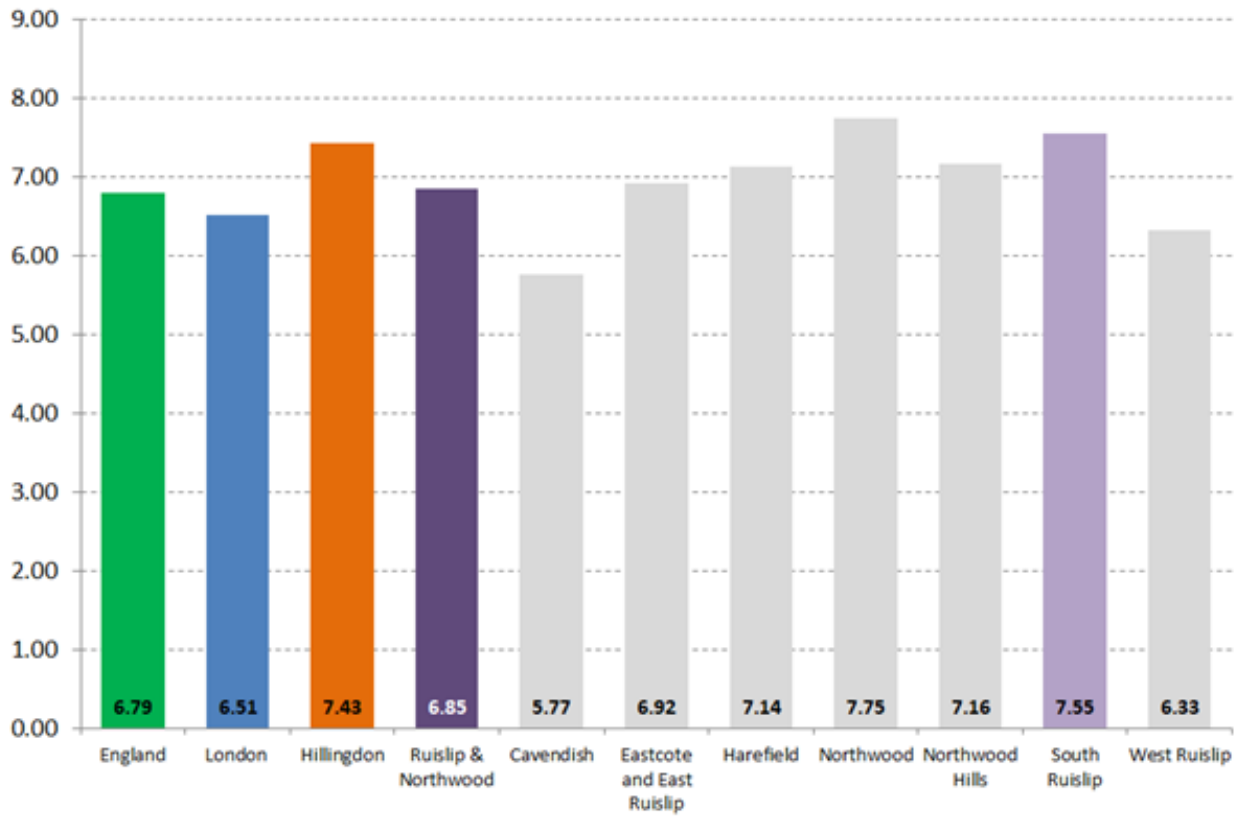

Chronic Kidney Disease prevalence, 2017/18



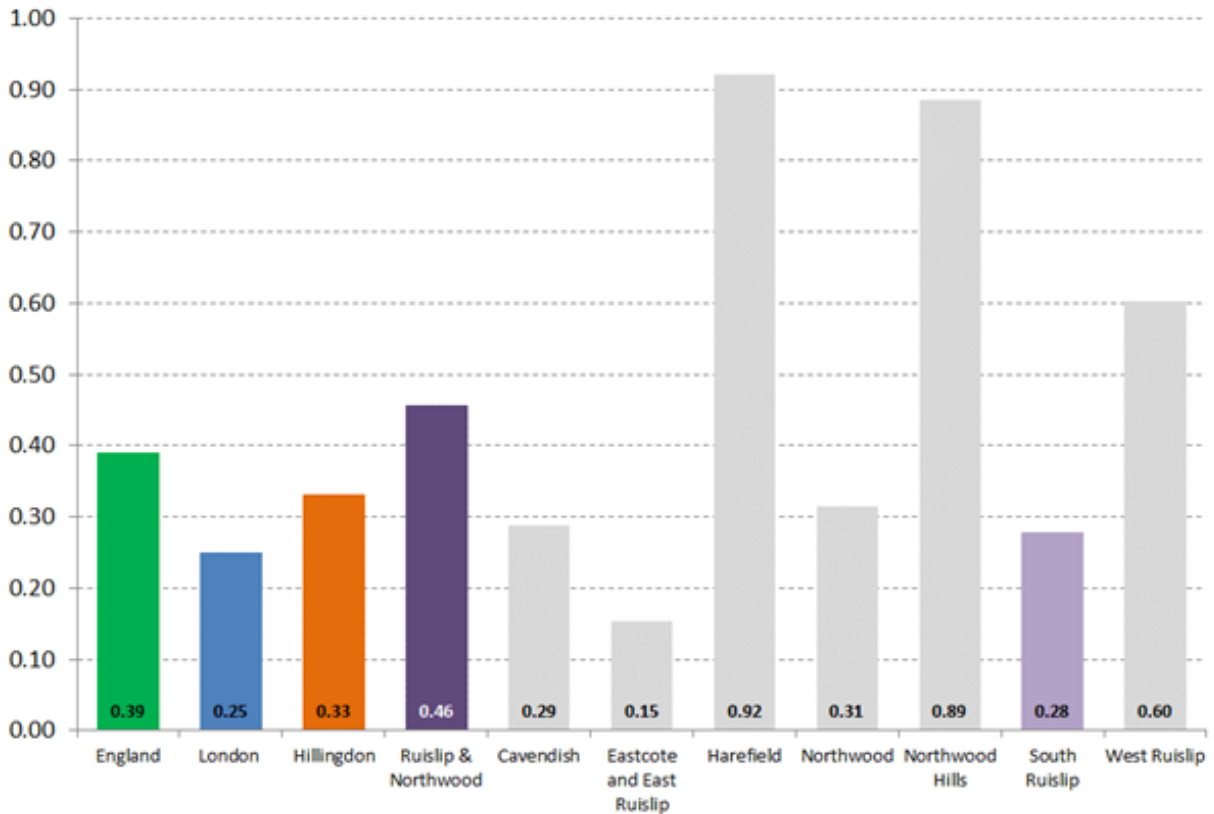

Diabetes prevalence, 2017/18



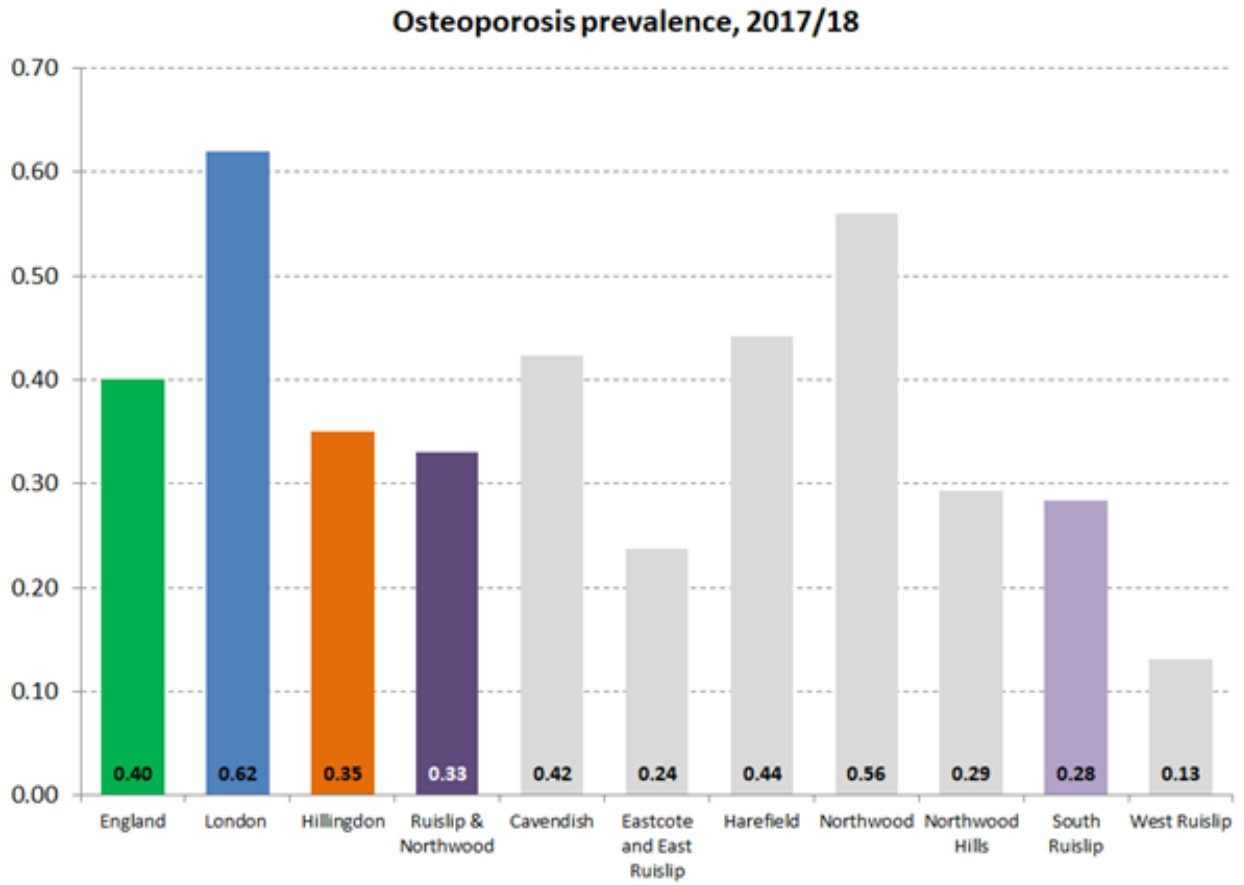

Palliative Care prevalence, 2017/18



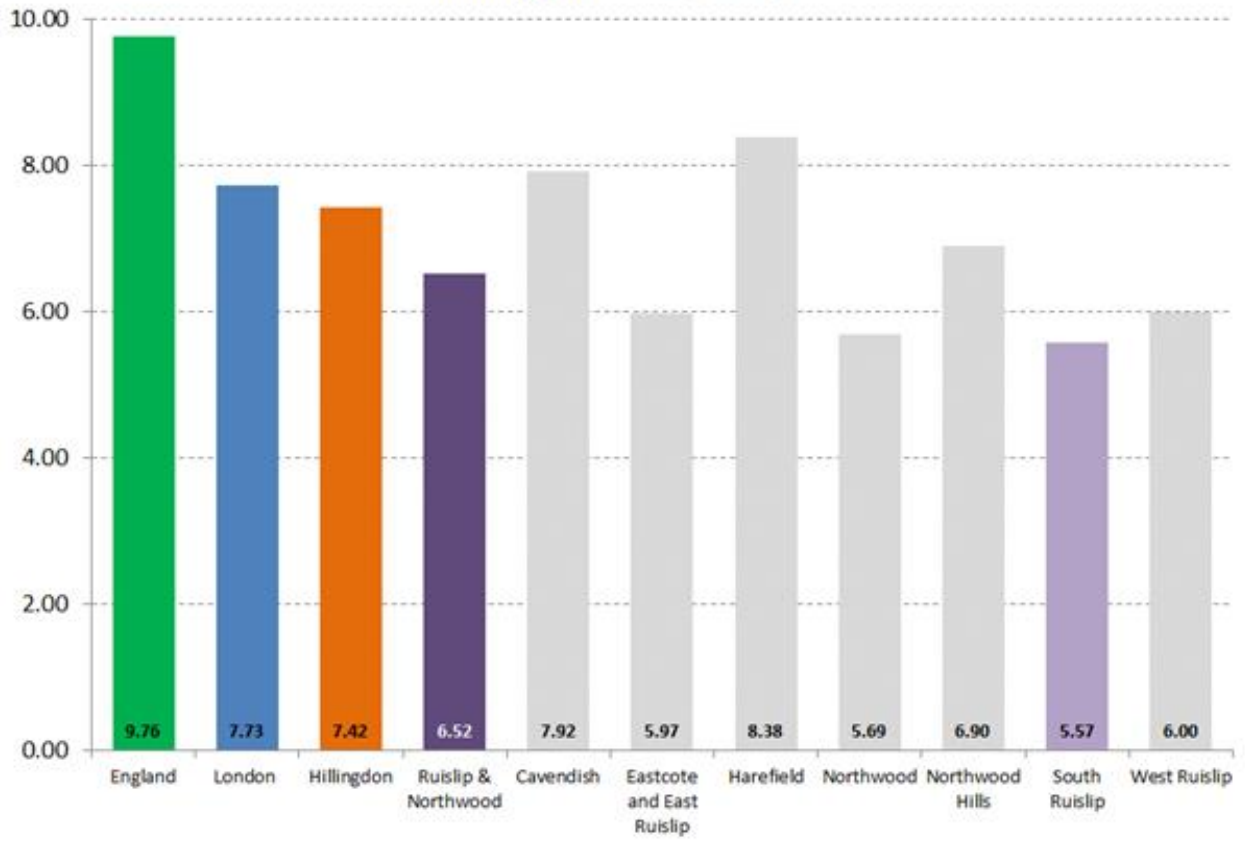

The estimated prevalence is the number of patients who may have a condition but who have not been diagnosed.

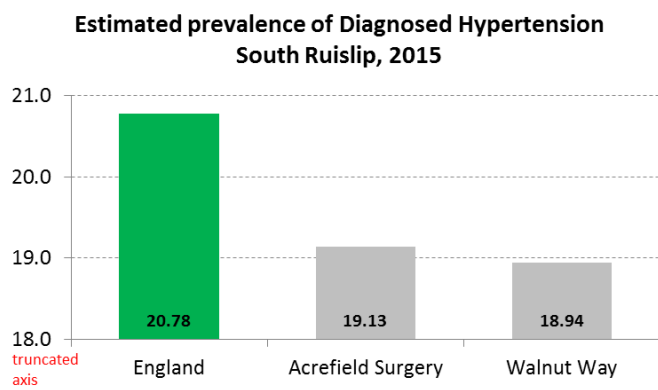

Estimated prevalence is available on a limited number of conditions; data is taken from the latest Disease & Risk Factor Prevalence profile on Fingertips, 2015 (<https://fingertips.phe.org.uk/profile/prevalence>).

South Ruislip ward contains 2 GP surgeries (Acrefield and Walnut Way). As before, patients registered with these GP practices do not necessarily live in the ward or borough.

Acrefield Surgery has the highest estimated prevalence of the 2 surgeries in the ward.

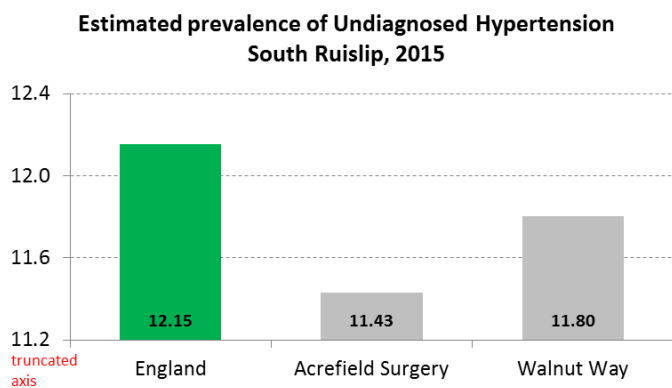

Walnut Way has the highest estimated prevalence of the 2 surgeries in the ward.

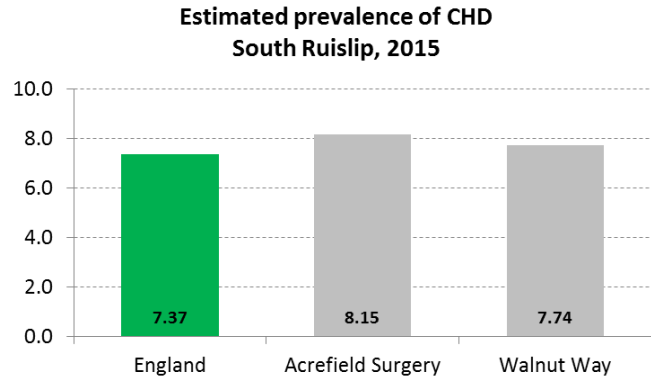

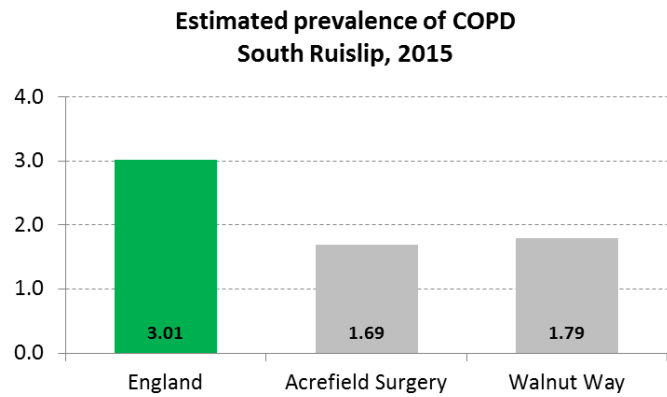

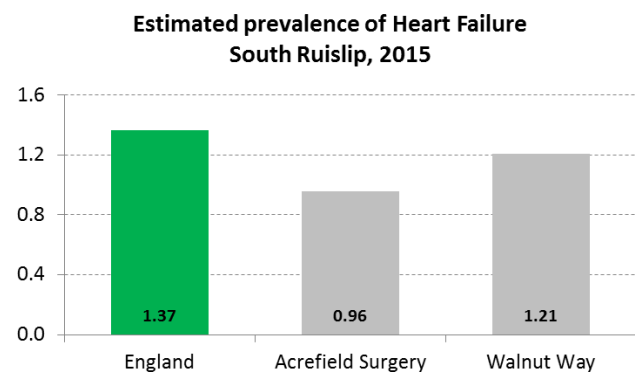

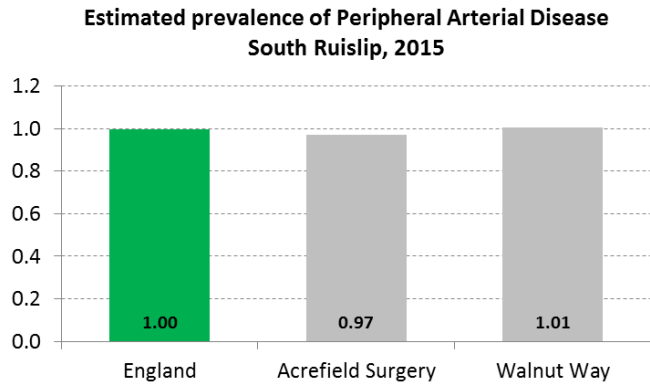

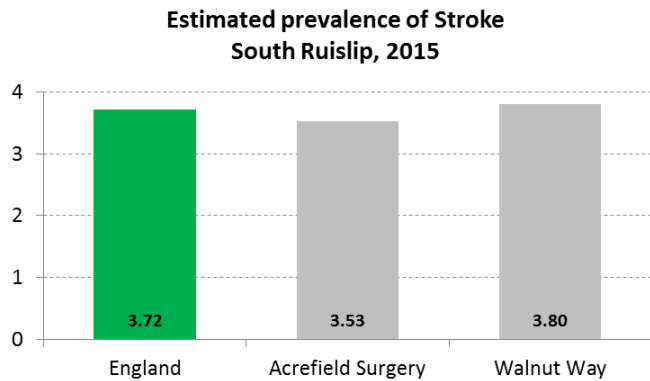

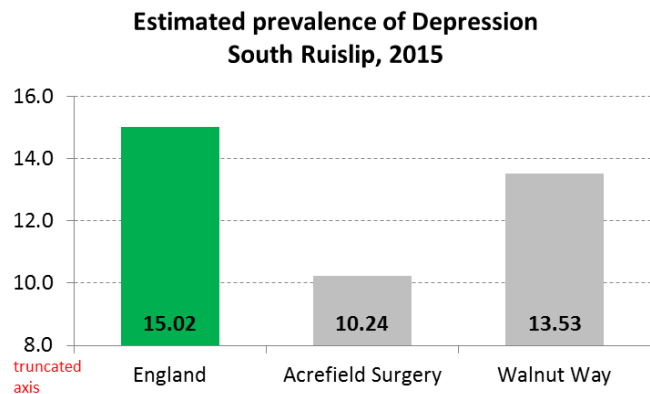
