

Hillingdon at a glance, 2017

- Population comparing the 2011 Census figures with those with GLA Interim 2015-based population projections, the borough's population in 2017 has increased by approximately 10.9% (from 273,936 to 303,870); by comparison London's population has increased by 8.5%. Over half of Hillingdon's 44.6 square miles is a mosaic of countryside including canals, rivers, parks and woodland. Hillingdon has an average of 25.9 people per hectare; this is the third lowest population density among London boroughs.
- **Gender** 152,246 of borough residents are male and 151,624 are female.
- Age 21.7% of the borough population is under 16, 6.1% over 75 and 72.1% aged 16-74 (this is defined as working age).
- Ethnicity Hillingdon's White British population decreased from 73% in the 2001 Census to 52% in the 2011 Census; Hillingdon's BAME population increased from 27% to 48% in the same period. Current data (from the Greater London Authority 2015 Round Trend-based Ethnic Group Population Projections) shows that Hillingdon's White British population in 2017 is 43% and the BAME population is 57%.
- Religion¹ the predominant religions in the borough at 2011 are Christian 134,813 (49.2%), Muslim 29,065 (10.6%), Hindu 22,033 (8%) and Sikh 18,230 (6.7%), we also have a large percentage of residents stating 'no religion' 46,492 (17%) and other 23,303 (8.5%).


West Ruislip Ward

West Ruislip lies in the north of Hillingdon and is bordered by Harefield, Northwood, Eastcote & East Ruislip, Manor, South Ruislip and Ickenham.

In 2017², West Ruislip's population is 11,744 residents, an increase of 10.7% since 2011 (10,611); this is similar to the 10.9% increase for Hillingdon overall. West Ruislip is made up of 439 hectares (4.4 km^{sq}), with 26.8 people per hectare (2,675 per km^{sq}). The average number of people per household is 2.2³.

Deprivation

The 2015 Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) calculate local measures of deprivation and indicates where each small area is ranked in relation to the whole of England. The map below shows patterns of deprivation within West Ruislip, which is made up of seven LSOAs⁴.





Ward Population:



The chart above shows that 17.8% of West Ruislip residents are under the age of 16. 74.0% of residents fall into the working age bracket (defined as a resident aged between 16 and 74) and the remaining 8.2% are over the age of 75.

The chart below shows that in West Ruislip, there are higher numbers of males and females in the 35-39 age bracket when compared to other age groups.




Gender

The proportion of **men to women** in the ward is 49.4% to 50.6%. This is a small change from 2011 when there was a 49.0% to 51.0% male to female ratio in the ward; so overall the proportion of men has increased relative to decrease in women.

The chart below shows male/female ratios in Hillingdon and ward level:


Male/Female ratio at Hillingdon and ward level, 2017




Ethnic make up 2011⁵

In the 2011 census, 82.0% of West Ruislip residents identified themselves as White British background (this includes English, Northern Irish, Scottish, Welsh, Irish, Gypsy or Irish Traveller and Other White). 3.5% from Mixed / Multiple Ethnic groups, 10.8% from Asian / Asian British background (including Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi and Chinese), 2.0% from Black / African / Caribbean / Black British backgrounds and 1.7% from other ethnic backgrounds (including Arab).

Hillingdon, Ethnic makeup 2011:





Religion⁶


Christianity is the predominant religion in the ward with 61.5% from this faith. 5.2% are Hindu, 2.7% are Muslim and 21.0% have no religion. 6.8% chose not to state a religion (the question was voluntary).

West Ruislip, Religion 2011:




Hillingdon, Religion 2011:

Country of Birth⁷

Of those living in West Ruislip, 88.1% were **born** in Europe (with 81.6% in the UK), 6.3% in the Middle East / Asia, 3.4% in Africa, and 2.3% in the Americas, Caribbean or Australasia. In West Ruislip, 18.4% were **born** outside of the UK (with 81.6% in the UK).


The preferred **language** in the ward is English with 92.6% residents stating this as their main language; of the remaining 7.4%, the majority speak English 'very well' or 'well'. Only 81 residents (10.7% of those where English is not their main language) state that they cannot speak English well or at all⁸.

Apart from English, the most spoken languages in the ward are Gujurati (79 residents, 0.8%) and Polish (79 residents, 0.8%).

Working age breakdown (ages 16-74):



In West Ruislip, the working age population of those in the age bracket 16-24 make up 10.2% of the ward population, whilst the 25-59 age group make up 67.6%, the remaining 22.3% are from the 60-74 age group.




Of those residents in employment, this chart provides an overview of the Occupation Types⁹ across West Ruislip ward:

The chart below shows income deprivation being varied across Hillingdon. At ward level, the percentage of people who live in income deprived households ranges from 4.8% in Ickenham to 21.7% in Townfield. West Ruislip is 8.1%, which is lower than the Hillingdon average (13.6%).

Households

In 2017, there were 5,410 households¹⁰ in West Ruislip, an increase of 612 since Census 2011. The majority of **housing type¹¹** within the ward is houses or bungalows (either detached, semi or terraced) at 67.2%, with 32.8% being flats or maisonettes (including those in a commercial building).





In West Ruislip, 68.4% of ward residents own their own homes, followed by 18.7% of properties being privately rented, 11.0% socially rented from the Council and the remaining residents make up 1.9% other (eg shared ownership, living rent free).








Health

Life expectancy is the number of years a person is expected to live on average. In West Ruislip, the life expectancy is estimated at 79.9 years for males and 83.4 years for females. This is below the averages for Hillingdon but above England.




Observed Prevalence¹²

These graphs show the recorded prevalence of long term conditions from the Quality & Outcomes Framework (QOF) 2017/18, at GP practice level. They show the calculated prevalence of patients on a GP register, recorded as having a given condition. It should be noted that patients registered in this ward do not necessarily live in the ward or the Borough.

The graphs show recorded prevalence at England, London, borough, locality and ward level. West Ruislip ward contains 4 GP surgeries (Wood Lane Medical Centre, King Edwards, Ladygate Lane and Southcote Clinic).












The prevalence of **heart failure** within West Ruislip is 0.58%; this is similar to the locality, higher than London and Hillingdon, and lower than England.




The prevalence of **hypertension** in West Ruislip is 15.99%, which is higher than England, London, Hillingdon and the locality:




The prevalence of **peripheral arterial disease** in West Ruislip is 0.54%, which is lower than England, but higher than London, Hillingdon and the locality:






The prevalence of **stroke / transient ischaemic attack (TIA)** is 1.59%, which is lower than England, but higher than London, Hillingdon and the locality:






COPD prevalence, 2017/18






Dementia prevalence, 2017/18





Learning Disabilities prevalence, 2017/18









Diabetes prevalence, 2017/18












The estimated prevalence is the number of patients who may have a condition but who have not been diagnosed.



West Ruislip ward contains 4 GP surgeries (Wood Lane Medical Centre, King Edwards, Ladygate Lane and Southcote Clinic). As before, patients registered with these GP practices do not necessarily live in the ward or borough.



King Edwards Medical Centre has the highest estimated prevalence of the 4 surgeries within the ward.


For comparison, the observed prevalence of CHD in West Ruislip is 2.89%.

Wood Lane Medical Centre has the highest estimated prevalence of the 4 surgeries within the ward.



King Edwards Medical Centre & Wood Lane Medical Centre have the highest estimated prevalence of the 4 surgeries within the ward.






